

SAINT MARY'S: OUR PARISH CEMETERY

If want to use the space in this week's Pastor's Note to lay out the most recent changes which have taken place this week at our parish cemetery of St. Mary's, which straddles the town line between Needham and Wellesley. (I realize many of our newer parishioners who travel from

outside the local area are unaware that we have a parish cemetery attached to Mary Immaculate. It is about a mile from the parish church, if you go down Elliot St. and continue straight into Central Ave. A small blue-and-white sign on Cedar St. directs you towards the Cemetery.)

Last fall, when our Cemetery Superintendent Sean Ward decided to retire, I made the decision to change over to an outside contractor instead of continuing to maintain our own crew of workmen and equipment. This did not mean that St. Mary's was no longer our parish cemetery, although it appears that many people have been under the impression that we had given it up to another governing authority.

Over the course of nine months, September 20011-June 2012, it became clear that the contractor services under the company Cemetery Services Inc. had not given us the results we had hoped for, and it was time to make another change for the care of St. Mary's. Our new contract-manager as of July 1st is parishioner Ron Goguen under his company Guardian Estate Management, Inc. Guardian will be responsible for carrying out all the operations and maintenance of the parish Cemetery. In addition, we have also called in an outside consultant Tom Daly from Cemetery Helpful Solutions (CHS) in Westwood to work with Ron in getting St. Mary's to the level at which it needs to be.

The parish office at the rectory will also handle the business administration of the cemetery office. Please call the rectory for any cemetery business (617-244-0558) from now on. Our goal is to maintain our parish Cemetery in such a way that it reflects these words printed in our 1970 parish centennial book: "St. Mary's Cemetery—a simple, yet lovely country burial ground lying like a jewel amid the encircling hills. Truly, here is a sacred tribute to God's love and mercy."

LATIN MASS TEXTS Traditional Propers Sixth Sunday After Pentecost

INTROIT: Psalm 27: 8-9 The Lord is the strength of His people, and the protector of the salvation of His anointed: save, O Lord, Thy people, and bless Thy inheritance, and rule them for ever. Psalm 27: 8 -9 Unto Thee will I cry, O Lord: O my God, be not Thou silent to me, lest if Thou be silent to me, I become like them that go down into the pit. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT O God of all power and might, who art the giver of all good things; implant in our hearts the love of Thy name, increase in us true religion, nourish us with all goodness and by Thy mercy keep us in the same. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: Romans 6: 3-11 Brethren, all we who are baptized in Christ Jesus are baptized in His death. For we are buried together with Him by baptism unto death; that as Christ is risen from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also may walk in newness of life. For if we have been planted together in the likeness of His death, we shall also be in the likeness of His resurrection. Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with Him, that the body of sin may be destroyed, and that we may serve sin no longer. For he that is dead is justified from sin. Now if ye be dead with Christ, we believe that we shall live also together with Christ. Knowing that Christ, rising again from the dead, dieth now no more, death shall no more have dominion over Him. For in that He died to sin He died once; but in that He liveth, He liveth unto God. So do you also reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God: in Christ Jesus our Lord.

And they did eat, and were filled; and they took up that which was left of the fragments, seven baskets: and they that had eaten were about four thousand: and He sent them away.
