THE FLIGHT INTO EGYPT

Last Saturday, November 24th, we welcomed the Syriac Catholic Mission of Our Lady of Mesopotamia to Mary Immaculate of Lourdes for the first time to celebrate their Divine Liturgy, according to the ancient Rite of St. James of Jerusalem. The celebrant for the Divine Liturgy/Mass was Fr. Stephen Bonian, S.J., a Jesuit priest from the Campion Jesuit Community in Weston and a fluent Arabic speaker.

Fr. Stephen began his homily by drawing the congregation's attention the stained glass window of the 'Flight into Egypt', which is the window over the inside doors of the front vestibule. He compared their plight as refugees from Iraq to that of the Holy Family in their flight down into Egypt to escape the wrath of Herod: they too have had to flee their homeland but the prayers of the Mary and St. Joseph have brought them safe to this country and now to

their new parish church.



Our new parishioners are fellow Catholics, but of a different liturgical rite: we are Latin/Roman Catholics who worship according to the Roman Rite (both in the ordinary & extraordinary forms) whereas as they are Syriac Catholics who worship according to the Rite of St. James, which comes out of the ancient Christian Church of Antioch. We are most welcome to attend their Divine Liturgy with them and receive Holy Communion. Although it is in Arabic and Aramaic, they have English-language hand-missals available for the congregation. It enriches our own appreciation of Christian life to contrast and compare the different rites. Their next scheduled Mass is for Saturday, December 8th, at 12 Noon.

Here follows prayers from the Preparatory Rites of the Mass of St. James, corresponding to our prayers of Confession of sin (*Confiteor* and *Kyrie*):

Through Your light we shall see the Light of Jesus, full of light. You are the true light that enlightens all creatures. O image of the heavenly Father, enlighten us with Your bright light.

O pure and holy One, who lives in the place of light, take from us our evil passions and impure thoughts. Grant us a pure heart so that we may live justly.

I knock at Your door, O Lord, pleading for mercy: for I am a sinner, who has neglected Your ways in my life: I confess and reject my sin so that I may live in Your grace...
