

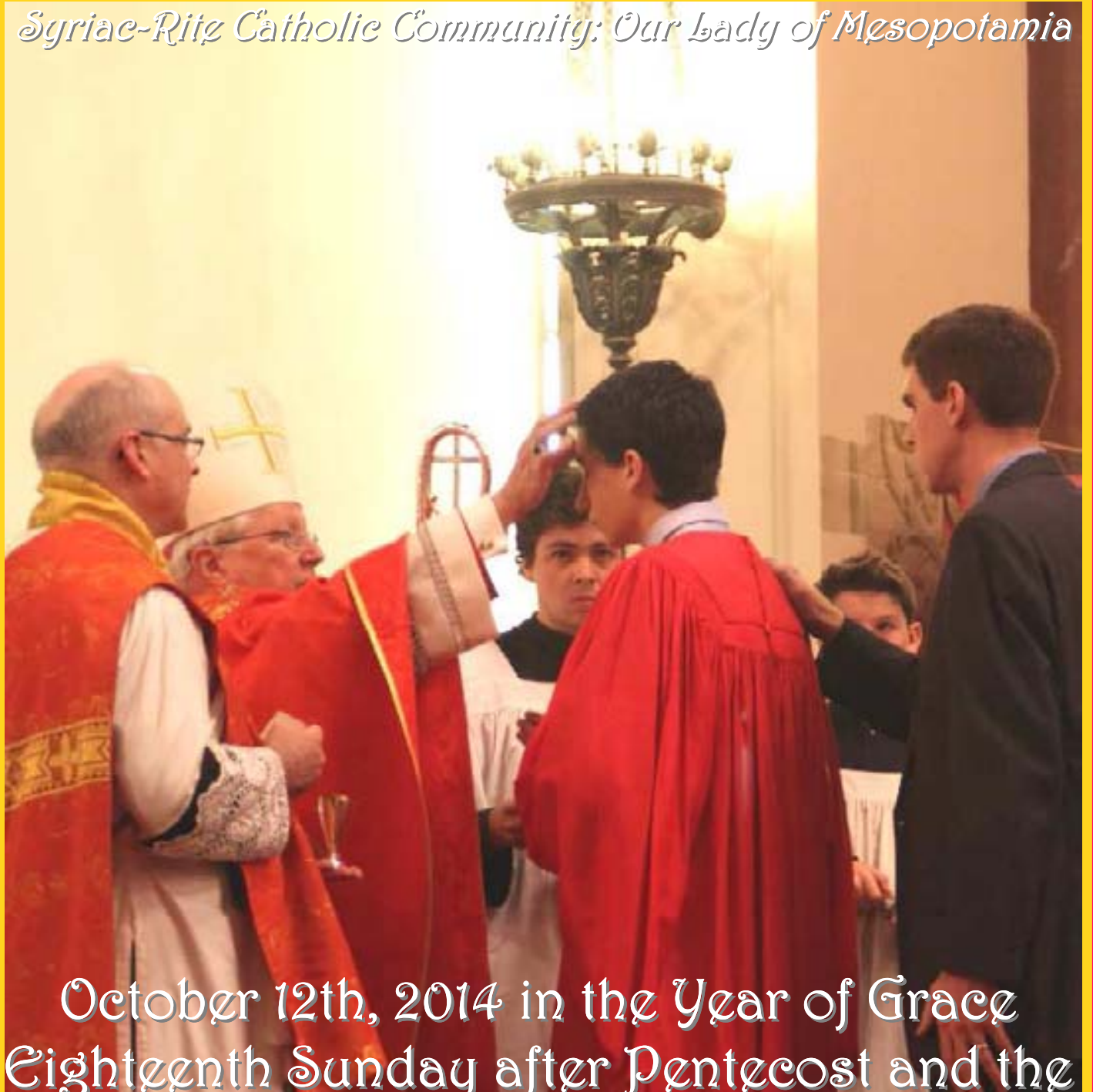

CHRISTOPHER COLUMBUS

On October 12th, 1492 Christopher Columbus, the Genoese sailor on a Royal Commission from Queen Isabella of Castille, made landfall on a Caribbean Island. As is well-known he intended to sail around the world to reach India and China and did not imagine that he had stumbled upon a “New World”.

Three hundred years later in 1792, Columbus’s discovery was celebrated by the new American Republic. In the course of the 19th century Christopher Columbus became one of our American national heroes. We have a federal holiday in his honor and he was celebrated in our schoolbooks.

By the time of the 500th Anniversary of Columbus’s voyage in 1992, however, he was denounced by many as a genocidal colonialist

whose name deserves to be on the list of history’s monsters. When I was in elementary school in the late 1960s-early 1970s we used to sing the songs in praise of Christopher Columbus, which were found in our music books, before the Columbus Day weekend. “*Captain Columbus sailed from Spain, with a yo-heave-ho! And he said, we’ll never turn back again, with a yo-heave-ho!...*” I doubt that those songs are still being sung in any American public schools today.

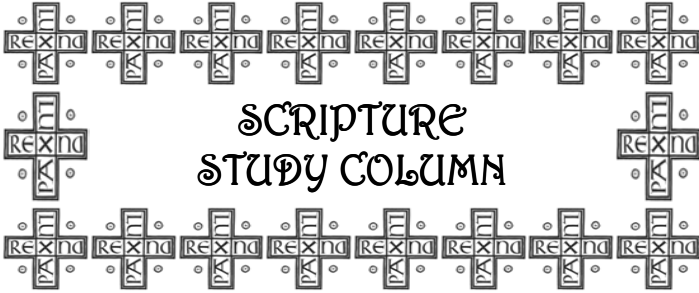
Commenting on the discrediting of Christopher Columbus in the late 20th century, historian Jacques Barzun called it a “*retrospective lynching.*”

Columbus was not the “*master criminal*” inspiring the Spanish colonists to commit all kinds of atrocities against the Amerindian natives they found there, out of greed and racist contempt, which they did. Furthermore the mistreatment of natives was strongly opposed by Queen Isabella herself and she issued edicts against it, as did her son and successor Charles V, but these were largely ineffective in the far-away lands where too many of the Europeans there did as they pleased. On Columbus’s second voyage there were “ten convicted murderers” on the boat.

Barzun also points out that history is full of successive conquests and subjugation of the conquered. The Amerindians whom the Spanish encountered (e.g. the Caribs and the Aztecs) had themselves conquered, killed and enslaved the tribes previously inhabiting that land. “*Today, this fusion or dispersion of peoples and cultures by means of death and destruction is abhorred in principle but flourishing in fact. Africa, the Middle East and Far East, and South Central Europe are still theaters and conquest and massacre. And Columbus is not the responsible party.*” (Jacques Barzun: *From Dawn to Decadence*, Harper-Collins, 2000.)

KNOW YOUR CATHOLIC FAITH



GOSPEL OF SAINT LUKE BIBLE STUDY (Luke 12:41-48)

As Jesus finishes His instructions on vigilance, St. Peter requests further clarification: "Lord, is this parable meant for us or for everyone?" (v. 41). We are right to interpret Jesus' parable on vigilance as applying to everyone (we all need to prepare for His coming),

but Jesus proceeds to make an application that is specific to His disciples. He replies to the question in the following way in vv. 42-43: "*Who, then, is the faithful and prudent steward whom the master will put in charge of his servants to distribute the food allowance at the proper time? Blessed is that servant whom his master on arrival finds doing so.*" The answer to St. Peter's question is in the affirmative: the disciples are to be "prudent stewards" on behalf of their Master as they await His return.

Other Scripture passages testify to this truth, as well. In St. John's Gospel, Jesus commands St. Peter to feed His lambs (cf. Jn. 21:15). Likewise, St. Paul calls himself and the other apostles "stewards of the mysteries of God," referring, in part, to the dispensing of the sacraments (cf. 1 Cor. 4:1). Thus, Jesus' description of the chief steward dispensing the "food allowance" to the servants has a mystical dimension.

Jesus also presents a converse scenario in which the head steward abuses his servants, gets drunk, and is totally unprepared for his master's return.

Consequently, he receives the master's wrath (vv. 45-46). Related to this is St. James' insight that those who are teachers in the Church will be judged more strictly than the rest (cf. Jam. 3:1).

Jesus then makes an important distinction between full and partial knowledge as it relates to culpability (guilt) in sin. He says the following in vv. 47-48a: "*That servant who knew his master's will but did not...act in accord with his will shall be beaten severely; and the servant who was ignorant of his master's will but acted in a way deserving of a severe beating shall be beaten only lightly.*" God is completely just: He judges the culpability of our sinful acts based upon our knowledge of His will, but this does not mean that the quality of our actions does not matter. God still judges sin for what it is: moral evil, the deprivation of the good.

So often we hear people exonerate others by saying something like "he didn't *mean* to do ____," the implication being that we should gloss over the bad quality of man's actions. This approach is incorrect, because we all know how the wounds of sin demand justice and reparation. One's intention can lessen culpability, and in certain cases even exculpate one entirely, but it cannot make a bad act good. The goodness or badness of acts lies in the *nature* of the acts themselves. For example, stealing is always an evil act, regardless of our intentions. A good end never justifies an evil means. The Church has *always* taught these things, and continues to do so (cf. Catechism nos. 1745-1746, 1749-1756, 1789).

Jesus concludes His teaching in v. 48b: "*Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more.*" Despite the blessings God has given us, temptations to self-pity, despondency, or envy come from time to time. Christ would have us live as good stewards, directing our energy towards having a good account of fidelity to our responsibilities before Him at His awesome judgment seat (cf. Byzantine Divine Liturgy). May we be found doing so!

EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: Ecclesiasticus 36:18.
