SCRIPTURE STUDY

SUNDAY EPISTLES STUDY TRINITY SUNDAY Romans II:33-36

St. Paul's words for today's Epistle remind us of the essential truth of God's transcendence. He is infinitely beyond any human concept or image. As he explains, "O the depth of the riches of the wisdom and of the knowledge of God! How incomprehensible are His judgments, and how unsearchable His ways!" (v. 33). At the same time, His transcendence does not render Him unknowable, unloveable, or unloving. God revealed himself to Moses at the burning bush, even disclosing His Name: "I Am who Am" (Ex. 3:14).

The Catechism of the Catholic Church has this to say about this crucial moment of revelation in paragraph no. 206: "The divine name is mysterious...[i]t is at once a name revealed and something like the refusal of a name...He is the 'hidden God,' His name is ineffable, and He is the God who makes Himself close to men." The Catechism further elucidates this mystery in paragraph no. 213: "The revelation of the ineffable name 'I Am who Am' contains then the truth that God alone IS...God is the fullness of Being and of every perfection, without origin and without end. All creatures receive all that they are and have from Him; but He alone is His very being..." This last line is what St. Paul means in v. 36 of today's Epistle: "For of Him, and by Him, and in Him, are all things." This is essentially the message of St. John in the Prologue to his Gospel: "All things were made by Him, and without Him was made nothing that was made" (cf. Jn. 1:3).

The Catechism again helps to explain the mystery of God's closeness to man in paragraph no. 207: "By revealing His name God at the same time reveals His faithfulness which is from everlasting to everlasting, valid for the past ('I am the God of your fathers'), as for the future ('I will be with you'). God, who reveals His name as 'I AM,' reveals Himself as the God who is always there, present to His people in order to save them." Thus, the God who transcends all things nevertheless draws close to us in His acts of salvation.

Meditation on these truths helps us enter into today's feast. We accept that the Trinity is a mystery beyond our full understanding. At the same time, we should seek to understand this dogma more deeply in light of divine revelation and the Church's teaching, because we "apprehend" or partake of this mystery in the sacraments (Kreeft, *Catholic Christianity*, 36). In the sacraments, we come to know God in His triune life personally, beginning with baptism.

In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus command the apostles to baptize in the Name of the Trinity (cf. Mt. 28:19). Only in Christ does it become clear that God, while One, is also a communion of three divine Persons. In paragraph no. 221, the Catechism explains the mystery of God's three-ness: "St. John...affirms that 'God is love': God's very being is love. By sending His only Son and the Spirit of Love in the fullness of time, God has revealed His innermost secret: God Himself is an eternal exchange of love, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and He has destined us to share in that exchange."

The end of the *Gloria Patri* implicitly points to the Christian hope of having a "share in that exchange": Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. By saying this prayer, we adore God in his divine life now, and pledge our desire to give him glory forever. The recitation of such a simple prayer allows us to make an act of faith, hope, and love all at once, and to anticipate the ineffable joys of heaven.

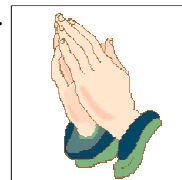

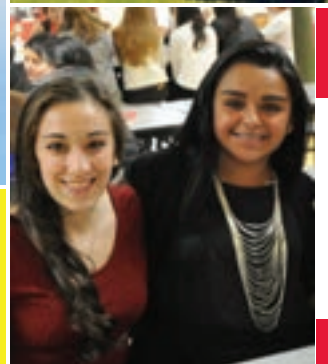
