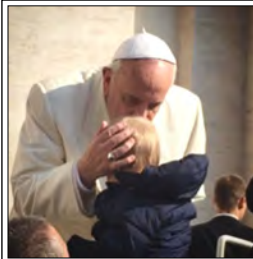
Parish Mission Statement

MISSION APPEALS AND A TRIDUUM OF CHARITY

Next Sunday we will welcome Fr. Robert Byamukama to our parish

of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes to make a Mission Appeal on behalf of his diocese of Fort Portal, Uganda. This visit is in accord with the Missionary Co-operative Appeal organized by the Office for the Propagation of the Faith in our Archdiocese of Boston. Each year parishes are assigned a particular religious order, diocese or charitable organization, which has been accepted by the Archbishop of Boston, to ask for the charity of our prayers and our financial support. A Second Collection is taken up at all of our Sunday Masses for the Mission Appeal.

In addition to this Mission Appeal we will also have a Mission Appeal for Fr. Salako on behalf of his S.M.A. Province of Benin/Niger on the last Sunday in August, as we have for the past four years.

This coming week we have on the Calendar of Saints for the 1962 Roman Missal a most beautiful "Triduum of Charity", for three Saints who were outstanding in their particular care for the poor. As Dr. Pius Parsch characterizes these days in *The Church's Year of Grace*:

On the next three days the Church commemorates saints who were heroic in the practice of charity—Camillus de Lellis, Vincent de Paul, and Jerome Emiliani. It is not an accidental sequence, because these feasts do not correspond to the days on which the three saints died. The first practiced heroic love toward the sick, the second toward the poor, the third toward orphans.

ST. CAMILLUS DE LELLIS, JULY 18th

After leading a reckless and dissolute life, he experienced a conversion at the age of 25, beginning on the Feast of the Purification (Feb. 2nd, 1575). At the age of 32 he began studying for the priesthood, and after ordination he founded a congregation of Religious Clerics, the "Ministers of the Sick". As a 4th Vow this community bound itself to care for the plague-stricken even at the risk of their own lives.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL, JULY 19th

St. Vincent de Paul died in 1660 at the age of 80. A French priest he founded a congregation of priests the Lazarists (Vincentians) and the Sisters of Charity. He has become the Patron Saint of all charitable organizations in the Church. *"Innumerable were his works of charity, e.g., freeing Christian slaves, caring for orphans, neglected children, fallen women, galley slaves, sick pilgrims tramps and beggars...It has been said that he would have been the only one who could have prevented the French Revolution."* (*The Church's Year of Grace, Vol. IV*).

ST. JEROME EMILIANI, JULY 20th

The "Father of Orphans", he devoted himself to the works of mercy in his home city of Venice, caring especially for orphans and establishing homes for them, expending his own fortune on their behalf. His principal house was at Somasco, after which the congregation he founded was named: the Clerks Regular of Somasco. He died while caring for the plague-stricken in 1537. He was 57 years old.

PRECIOUS BLOOD

Missale Romanum 1962(MR '62)

For today's meditation on the Collects of the Roman Missal, July being the month devoted to the Precious Blood, we consider the Collect for the Feast of the Most Precious Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ (MR'62). This feast is observed in the old calendar on July 1st, but the whole of the month of July is also traditionally devoted to this aspect of Our Lord's Sacred Humanity. Below is the English translation of this prayer in the *Saint Edmund Campion Missal and Hymnal*:

"Almighty, eternal God, Who hast appointed Thine only-begotten Son to be the Redeemer of the world, and hast willed to be appeased by His blood, grant us, we beseech Thee, so incessantly to worship the price of our salvation, and to be so defended by its power from the ills of this life on earth, that we may enjoy its everlasting fruit in heaven. Through the same our Lord, etc. Amen."

The second of the two motive clauses in our Collect-
"and to be so defended by its power from the ills of this life on earth"- merits a lengthy quotation from a sermon of St. John Chrysostom, fittingly chosen for use in Matins of the feast of the Precious Blood. In Homily 84 on St. John's Gospel, Chrysostom comments upon the use of lamb's blood in the Passover in Egypt, and how its defensive power against the tenth plague foreshadows the infinitely greater power of Christ's Blood imbibed by the faithful in Holy Communion:

"And just so did this unconscious blood [i.e., the blood of the Passover lamb] deliver the lives of men, not because it was blood, but because it foreshadowed the shedding of the Blood of Jesus. On that night in Egypt, when the destroying Angel saw the blood upon the lintel and on the two side-posts, he passed

over the door, and came not in unto the house. Even so now much more will the destroyer of souls flee away when he seeth, not the lintel and the two side-posts sprinkled with the blood of a lamb, but the mouth of the faithful Christian, the living dwelling of the Holy Ghost, shining with the blood of the True Messiah. If the Angel let the type be, how shall not the enemy quail before the Reality?" (English translation taken from www.divinumofficium.com).

We do well to be reminded at times of the great spiritual protection afforded us in a worthy reception of Holy Communion. A balanced and well-ordered Catholic spirituality is one that is focused in large part on Christ Himself and His grace in the Blessed Sacrament, as well as Our Lady (i.e., the spirituality of St. Louis de Montfort, for example) and our consequent growth in Faith, Hope, and Charity. We must increase our faith and confidence in the graces we receive in each worthy reception of Holy Communion.

Once such grace is Christ's divine protection and assistance for the Church at large and for individual disciples. Accordingly, we must develop a strong and, I would say, even an *ebullient* confidence in Our Lord's promises to His Church, and know for certain that we are indeed protected and nurtured by Him through Mary at each Sacred Liturgy. The truth and power of Psalm 23 (to take one example of Christ's promises to his Church), is absolutely renewed at each Mass, *for the graces we receive from the Good Shepherd apply to the specific needs and difficulties we encounter each passing day*. [Such an approach to the Mass and the reception of Holy Communion is the central idea of Bl. Columba Marmion, OSB, in his classic work, *Christ in His Mysteries*].

This perspective towards the Mass is essentially what St. John Chrysostom (always worthy of mention!) shows us in the priest's prayer following the Our Father in his beautiful Divine Liturgy:

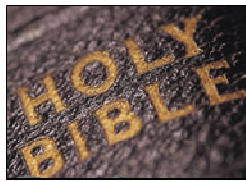

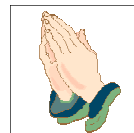

LATIN MASS PROPERS: FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: *Psalm 26: 7, 9* Hear, O Lord, my voice with which I have cried to Thee: be Thou my helper, forsake me not, nor do Thou despise me, O God my Saviour. *Psalm 26: 1* The Lord is my light, and my salvation, whom shall I fear. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT O God, who hast prepared for those who love Thee such good things as eye hath not seen; pour into our hearts such love towards Thee, that we loving Thee above all things, may obtain Thy promises, which exceed all that we can desire. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: *I Peter 3: 8-15* Dearly beloved: Be ye all of one mind, having compassion one of another, being lovers of the brotherhood, merciful, modest, humble; not rendering evil for evil, nor railing for railing, but contrariwise, blessing: for unto this are you called, that you may inherit a blessing. For he that will love life, and see good days, let him refrain his tongue from evil, and his lips that they speak no guile. Let him decline from evil and do good; let him seek after peace, and pursue it; because the eyes of the Lord are upon the just, and His ears unto their prayers, but the countenance of the Lord is against them that do evil things. And who is he that can hurt you, if you be zealous of good? But if also you suffer anything for justice' sake, blessed are ye. And be not afraid of their fear, and be not troubled; but sanctify the Lord Christ in your hearts.

GRADUAL: *Psalm 83: 9, 10* Behold, O God our protector and look on Thy servants. *V.* O Lord God of hosts, give ear to the prayers of Thy servants. Alleluia, alleluia. *Psalm 20: 1 V.* In Thy strength, O Lord, the king shall joy; and in Thy salvation he shall rejoice exceedingly. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Matthew 5: 20-24* **At** that time, Jesus said to His disciples: Except your justice abound more than that of the Scribes and Pharisees, you shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven. You have heard that it was said to them of old: Thou shalt not kill; and whosoever shall kill, shall be in danger of the judgment. But I say to you that whosoever is angry with his brother, shall be in danger of the judgment; and whosoever shall say to his brother: *Raca*, shall be in danger of the council; and whosoever shall say: Thou fool, shall be in danger of hell fire. If therefore thou offer thy gift at the altar, and there thou remember that thy brother hath anything against thee, leave there thy offering before the altar, and go first to be reconciled to thy brother; and then coming thou shalt offer thy gift.

OFFERTORY: *Psalm 15: 7, 8* I will bless the Lord, who hath given me understanding; I set God always in my sight; for He is at my right hand, that I be not moved.

SECRET Be appeased, we beseech Thee, O Lord, by our supplications: and in Thy loving kindness, accept the offerings Thy servants and handmaidens lay before Thee, that the offerings of each to the glory of Thy name may profit all alike unto salvation. Through our Lord.

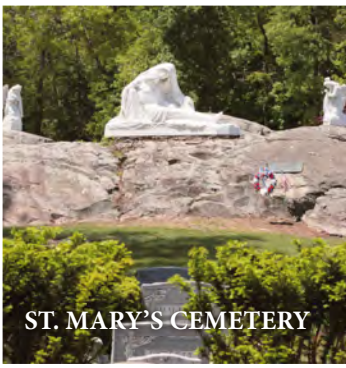

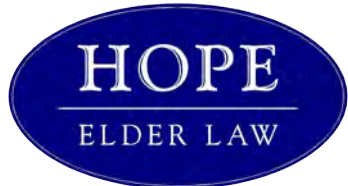
