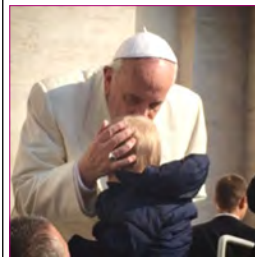
Parish Mission Statement

Pastor's Note



TIME AFTER EPIPHANY

Although the Christmas Feast ends with the Octave Day of Epiphany on January 13th, the Christmas Cycle of the Year

continues until the Sunday of Septuagesima (10 Sundays before Easter) and the beginning of the Easter Cycle. This year Septuagesima will fall on February 9th.

The last Feast of the Christmas Cycle, however, is always February 2nd, 40 Days after Christmas, when Mary and Joseph brought the Child Jesus to the Temple for His Presentation and Mary's ritual Purification. This Feast is also known as "Candlemas Day". Since Candlemas Day falls on a Sunday this year, all of our Masses next week will be for the Feast Day instead of the 4th Sunday after Epiphany/4th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

At our 10:30 Latin Mass we will have the Blessing of the Candles with the Procession as part of the Liturgy. I encourage people to bring candles for blessing to Mass next Sunday, for use in their homes during the year. A table will be set up for them by the altar rail. At the 10:30 Mass, these candles will be blessed together with the Candlemas tapers. At all of the other

Masses the priest-celebrant will give the simple blessing.

(The Announcement of Easter and the
Moveable Feasts:)**

**Know, dear brethren, that as we have
rejoiced at the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus
Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we
announce to you also the joy of His
Resurrection who is our Savior:**

**The Sunday of Septuagesima is the 9th
Day of February.**

**On the 26th Day of February will fall Ash
Wednesday, and the beginning of the Fast
of the most sacred Lenten Season.**

**On the 12th Day of April you will
celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal
Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ.**

**On the 21st Day of May will be the
Ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ.**

**On the 31st Day of May, the Feast of
Pentecost.**

**On the 11th Day of June, the Feast of
Corpus Christi.**

**On the 29th Day of November, the First
Sunday of the Advent of Our Lord Jesus
Christ, to whom is honor and glory

**THIRD SUNDAY IN
ORDINARY TIME (SUNDAY OF
THE WORD OF GOD)**

(Missale Romanum 1970)

*“Almighty ever-living God, direct our actions according to
Your good pleasure, that in the name of Your beloved Son we
may abound in good works. Through our Lord, etc. Amen.”*

In this prayer, we ask God for his assistance in the concrete actions of daily life. We should not gloss over the assumptions this prayer makes about God's involvement in the world and our individual lives, namely, that He is involved in a mysterious way in the nitty gritty, and that He is pleased with good moral acts. Furthermore, it assumes that we can actually know what God wants of us in life, because He has made it known.

These assumptions are integral to the worldview of most adherents of monotheistic religions. However, far too many people have no real conviction at all about the involvement of a divine being in the world's affairs, let alone the private moral choices of an individual. This growing problem underscores the importance of deepening our own knowledge and love of divine revelation, and not taking it for granted. By praying such a Collect immediately prior to the readings of Scripture today, we are primed for attentive listening, for God's written revelation is one of the principal ways He directs us to abound in good works.

Today's Old Testament reading, psalm, and Gospel all speak about *light*, and light is something that *reveals* things which are unknown or only partly known, so as to make them clearer and more distinct. Isaiah speaks directly to the decay of the sinful Northern Kingdom. The prophet proclaims that God Himself nevertheless would shine the

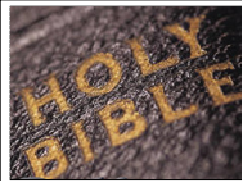
rehabilitative and joyful light of his truth on these idolatrous people to direct them towards the good.

The Evangelist St. Matthew references this passage in our Gospel, showing that it is Christ Himself who fulfills this prophecy, since He lived and worked in this geographic locale. Christ reveals God's love and leads people to repentance, i.e., a conversion of heart and mind resulting in good works in tune with the divine will. Our praying of the collect above, then, recognizes that when we hear the Scriptures, we encounter Jesus. The light of His truth frees us from the darkness of ignorance and sin, enabling us to do His will.

In his September 30th *motu proprio* of this past year 2019 entitled *Aperuit illis*, Pope Francis declared that the third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be known henceforth as the "Sunday of the Word of God" (AI nos. 3-4). As he explains in this document, this initiative is in response to requests around the world, and is linked to the recent extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy. As we honor God's revelation today in a particular way, our Collect challenges us to know better what it is that God graciously desires of us, so that we may do it.

Indeed, abounding in good works rests upon a deepening knowledge of God's will as it is revealed in Scripture. As Jesus says, "If you continue in My word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free" (Jn. 8:31-2, RSV). And again, "Not every one who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of my Father who is in heaven" (Mt. 7:21, RSV).

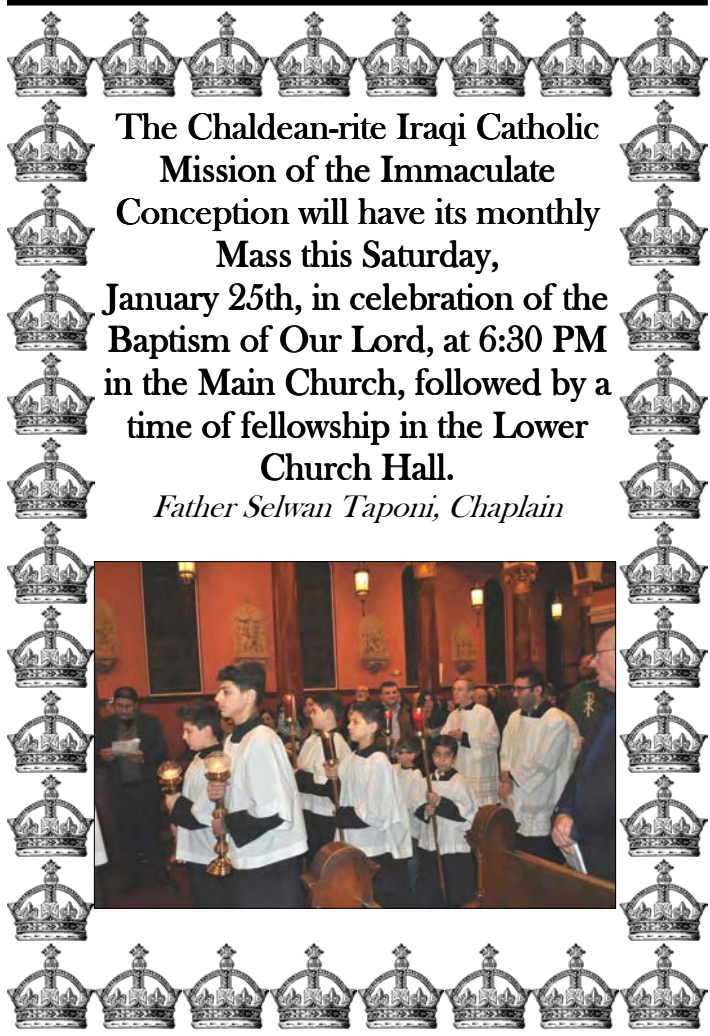

LATIN MASS PROPERS: THIRD SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

INTROIT: Psalm 96. 7-8, 1 Adore God, all you His Angels: Sion heard, and was glad: and the daughters of Juda rejoiced. *Ps. ibid.* 1. The Lord hath reigned, let the earth rejoice: let many islands be glad. *Ÿ.* Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — Adore God ...

COLLECT: O almighty and everlasting God, look mercifully upon our weakness: and stretch forth the right hand of Thy Majesty to protect us. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son ...

EPISTLE: From Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Romans, 12. 16-21 Brethren: Be not wise in your own conceits. To no man rendering evil for evil: providing good things, not only in the sight of God, but also in the sight of all men. If it be possible, as much as is in you, have peace with all men. Revenge not yourselves, my dearly beloved, but give place unto wrath, for it is written: Revenge is mine: I will repay, saith the Lord. But if thine enemy be hungry, give him to eat: if he thirst, give him to drink: for doing this, thou shalt heap coals of fire upon his head. Be not overcome by evil, but overcome evil by good.

And when he had entered into Capharnaum, there came to him a centurion, beseeching Him, and saying: Lord, my servant lieth at home sick of the palsy, and is grievously tormented. And Jesus saith to him: I will come and heal him. And the centurion making answer, said: Lord, I am not worthy that Thou shouldst enter under my roof: but only say the word, and my servant shall be healed. For I also am a man subject to authority, having under me soldiers; and I say to this one: go, and he goeth; and to another, Come, and he cometh; and to my servant: Do this, and he doeth it. And Jesus hearing this, marveled, and said to them that followed Him: Amen I say to you, I have not found so great faith in Israel. And I say to you that many shall come from the east and the west, and shall sit down with Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven: but the children of the kingdom shall be cast out into the exterior darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. And Jesus said to the centurion: Go, and as thou hast believed, so be it done to thee. And the servant was healed at the same hour.

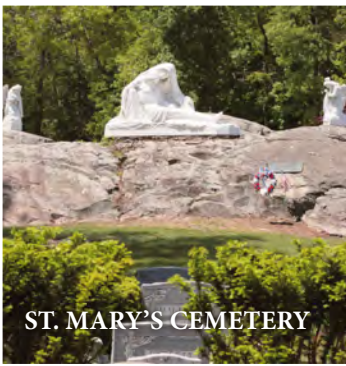

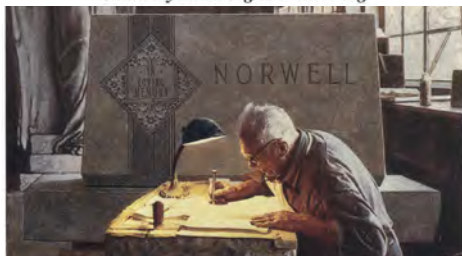
