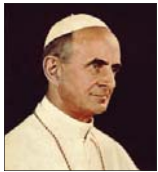

ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE PARISH AND CEMETERY, FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020

This Sunday I am making available to you the Annual Report on the financial state of our parish church and parish cemetery for the Fiscal Year which ended on June 30th, 2020. Photocopies of the Report are available to you in the pamphlet rack located in the front vestibule of the main church. There are two colored sheets: yellow for the parish church (double-sided) and blue for St. Mary's Cemetery (single-sided).

During the first weeks of the Coronavirus Pandemic in March and April, when public Masses were suspended and no gatherings were allowed in church, I was bracing myself for a financial free-fall. As you can see from this report this was not what ended up happening. Thanks to the generosity of you, the lay-faithful, contributions and gifts continued to come in through the mail and on-line giving. It is a testimony to your living faith, your sense of duty, and your love for the Sacraments that you have supported your parish church on the whole, if anything, even *more* generously. During this time we have also been able to welcome many new parishioners who have registered as official members of the parish and who have also been giving at "stewardship level".

To all of you who have continued to make sacrificial gifts for the support of the Church, despite your own sufferings and financial stresses, I can only express my heart-felt gratitude. You have been truly practicing the virtue of giving-a-gift-back-to-God in the gifts you have made to Mary Immaculate of Lourdes. When the numbers for the last Fiscal Year were all added up, the parish had an operating expense deficit of **\$26,561**. Fortunately, we have savings in reserve to cover it. We are able

Again, I thank you for all of your church support and extra gifts to keep our parish of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes going. I thank you for all of the personal sacrifices you are making to do so. May God bless you and reward you for it.

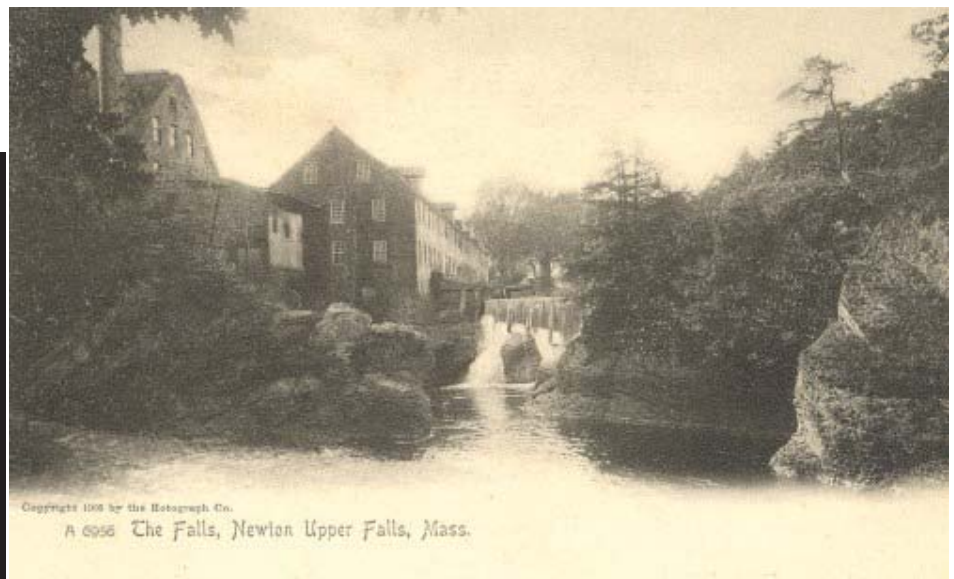

LATIN MASS PROPERS: OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY

Give not place to the devil. He that stole, let him now steal no more; but rather let him labor, working with his hands the thing which is good, that he may have something to give to him that suffereth need.

Again he sent other servants, saying: Tell them that were invited: Behold, I have prepared my dinner; my beeves and fattlings are killed, and all things are ready: come ye to the marriage. But they neglected: and went their ways, one to his farm, and another to his merchandise; and the rest laid hands on his servants, and having treated them contumeliously, put them to death. But when the king had heard of it, he was angry; and sending his armies, he destroyed those murderers, and burnt their city. 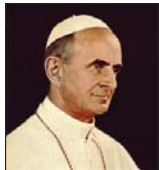

In the Sacrifice of the Mass Christ Is Made Sacramentally Present (continued)

The Council of Trent, basing itself on this faith of the Church, "openly and sincerely professes that within the Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist, after the Consecration of the bread and wine, Our Lord Jesus Christ, true God and true Man, is really, truly and substantially contained under those outward appearances." In this way, the Savior in His Humanity is present not only at the right hand of the Father according to the natural manner of existence, but also in the Sacrament of the Eucharist "by a mode of existence which we cannot express in words, but which, with a mind illumined by faith, we can conceive, and must most firmly believe, to be possible to God."

Christ Our Lord Is Present in the Sacrament of the Eucharist by Transubstantiation

To avoid misunderstanding this sacramental presence which surpasses the laws of nature and constitutes the greatest miracle of its kind we must listen with docility to the voice of the teaching and praying Church. This voice, which constantly echoes the voice of Christ, assures us that the way Christ is made present in this Sacrament is none other than by the change of the whole substance of the bread into His Body, and that of the whole substance of the

wine into His Blood, and that this unique and truly wonderful change the Catholic Church rightly calls Transubstantiation. As a result of Transubstantiation, the species of bread and wine undoubtedly take on a new meaning and a new finality, for they no longer remain ordinary bread and ordinary wine, but become the sign of something sacred, the sign of a spiritual food. However, the reason they take on this new significance and this new finality is simply because they contain a new "reality" which we may justly term ontological. Not that there lies under those species what was already there before, but something quite different, and that not only because of the faith of the Church, but in objective reality, since after the change of the substance or nature of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ, nothing remains of the bread and wine but the appearances, under which Christ, whole and entire, in His physical "reality" is bodily present, although not in the same way that bodies are present in a given place.

For this reason the Fathers took special care to warn the faithful that in reflecting on this most august Sacrament, they should not trust to their senses, which read only the properties of bread and wine, but rather the words of Christ...

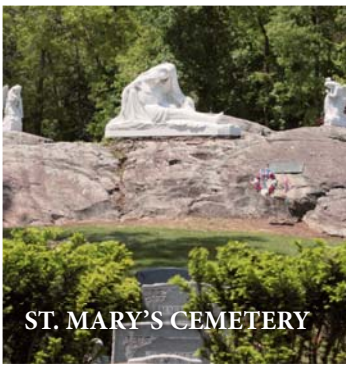

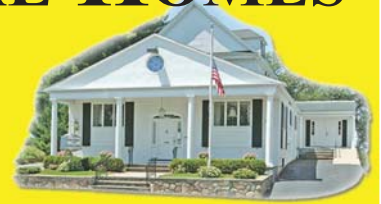

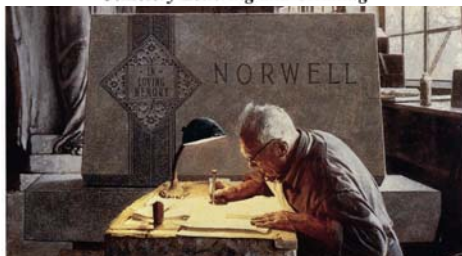
