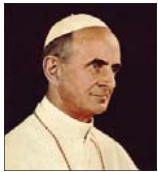

Pastor's Note

MAY 1st, ST. JOSEPH THE WORKMAN

In tracing out the development of the devotion to St. Joseph under his title, "Patron of the Universal Church" we can

sketch out the following:

- ◆ 1847: Pope Pius IX instituted a new Feast on the Church's Calendar, "The Patronage of St. Joseph", to be celebrated on the Third Sunday after Easter.
- ◆ 1870: December—in the wake of the overthrow of the Pope's temporal rule in the city of Rome, with Church's patrimony being plundered throughout the new Kingdom of Italy, Pius IX formally bestowed upon St. Joseph the title "Patron of the Universal Church."

- ◆ 1912: With the conflict between the Papacy and the Kingdom of Italy very much unresolved, Pope Pius X revised the Easter Feast of the Patronage of St. Joseph. He called it the Solemnity of St. Joseph and instituted it as an Octave from the Third to the Fourth Wednesday after Easter.
- ◆ 1929: Pope Pius XI made an agreement with the Italian fascist dictator Benito Mussolini which restored a formal sovereignty to the Pope by carving out a part of Rome around St. Peter's at the Vatican and calling it the Vatican City State.
- ◆ 1955: In the aftermath of World War II the power of the Communist Party sharply increased. The countries of Central and Eastern Europe occupied by the Soviet Red Army became satellite Communist countries of the Soviet Union. Outside of the Socialist-bloc the Communist Party enjoyed a great deal of prestige and power among both

intellectuals and the working classes. This was particularly true in Italy, now a fractious Republic. The Communist Party was seen as the premier anti-fascist Party, as against the Catholic Church which had made its peace with Mussolini and his fascist dictatorship and, in fact, had materially benefited from it. The Communists, claiming to be the authentic voice of the working class and its revolutionary vanguard, promised a radical remedy for social injustice. The Catholic Church in Italy was an obvious target for the Communists—an object against which to foment popular hatred and a foil for preaching the coming (historically inevitable) World Revolution.

May 1st, “May Day”, was the International Day of the Worker and a day each year when the Communist Party showed its growing strength in the streets by parades and mass meetings. This was the reason behind Pope Pius XII’s decision to supersede the Solemnity of St. Joseph with an entirely new feast of St. Joseph which he entitled *St. Joseph the Worker*. Pius X had used the same Mass and Office of Pius IX’s “Patronage of St. Joseph”, but Pius XII had new liturgical offices created, with an eye towards countering the Communist propaganda. St. Joseph, the Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Foster-father of Jesus, and a carpenter who worked by the labor of his hands and the sweat of his brow, was as good a proletarian as any stylized worker the Communist Party chose to represent. Thus, Catholic worship and piety celebrated its own workers on May Day under the patronage of St. Joseph. After Vatican II this Feast of St. Joseph the Worker was retained in the new Roman Missal promulgated by Pope Paul VI.

EPISTLE: From the Epistle of Blessed James the Apostle (James 1. 17-21) Dearly beloved, every best gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no change nor shadow of alteration. For of His own will hath He begotten us by the word of truth, that we might be some beginning of His creature. You know, my dearest brethren. And let every man be swift to hear but slow to speak and slow to anger. For the anger of man worketh not the justice of God. Wherefore, casting away all uncleanness and abundance of naughtiness, with meekness receive the ingrafted word, which is able to save your souls.

I have yet many things to say to you; but you cannot bear them now. But when He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will teach you all truth. For He shall not speak of Himself: but what things soever He shall hear He shall speak, and the things that are to come, He shall show you. He shall glorify Me: because He shall receive of Mine and shall show it to you.

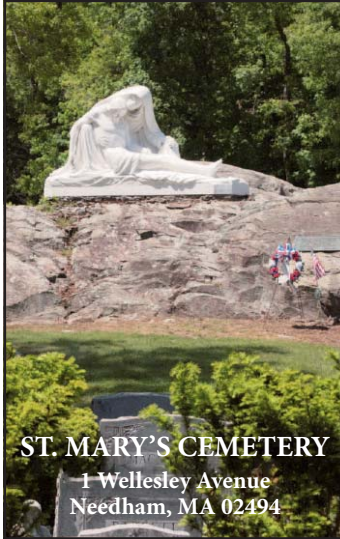

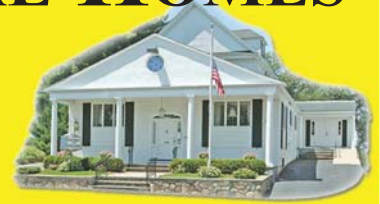

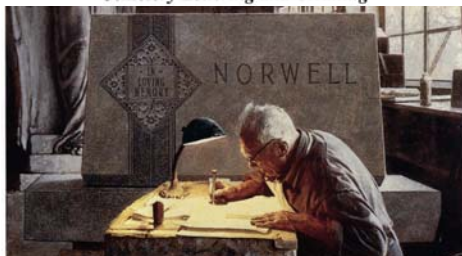
