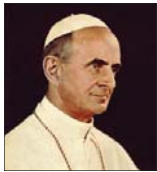

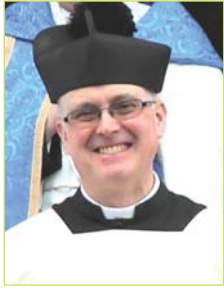

TE DEUM LAUDAMUS: “WE PRAISE THEE, O GOD”

Last year on Pentecost Sunday we celebrated the resumption of public Masses after months of suppression. This year on Pentecost we look forward to the ending of the COVID-19 protocols which have been in place for so long. For us, the intention of the “Marathon of Prayer” to Our Lady during this Month of May, “*For an end to the Pandemic, and for the resumption of our social and economic life,*” is already being fulfilled. Once the state restrictions on houses of worship are lifted at the end of the month we expect to be able to resume normal life here in church.

Allowed to return to full capacity, we will no longer need to have the 11:15 overflow Mass downstairs on Sunday mornings. Starting Sunday, June 6th, 2021 there will be one Traditional Latin High Mass on Sundays at 11 AM, and then another Traditional Latin Mass, as a Low Mass, on Sundays at 5:30 PM.

As a parish family God has been very good to us over the course of this Pandemic 2020-2021. We have been able to stay open throughout, providing access to Mass and the Sacraments. We have been spared any COVID outbreak traceable to the church. Also, no-one in our parish family has died or become seriously ill from the COVID. (Sorrows of life there have been amongst us to be sure—but of the normal, usual kind.) We do well at this moment to offer up a solemn, heartfelt thanksgiving to God in *Te Deum* for all that He has spared us.

Another cause for *Te Deum* is the Fifth Anniversary of Ordination for the three priests who celebrated their Masses of Thanksgiving here at Mary Immaculate of Lourdes back in 2016: Fr. Stephen LeBlanc, our parochial vicar (ordained May 21st), Fr. Juan Carlos Rivera, S.J.

(ordained June 11th) and Fr. Jon Tveit, former parishioner and parish Sacristan (ordained May 28th), who is a priest of the Archdiocese of New York. Here below are pictures of their celebrations here at the parish:

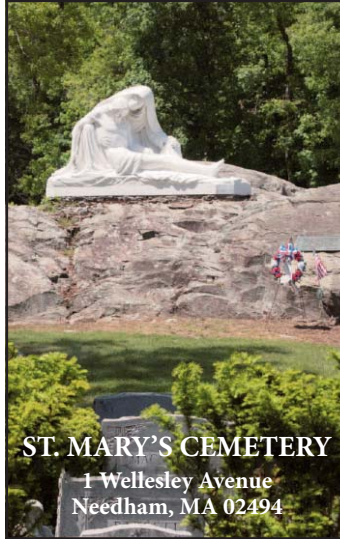

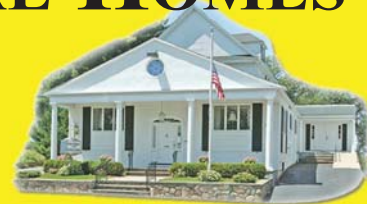

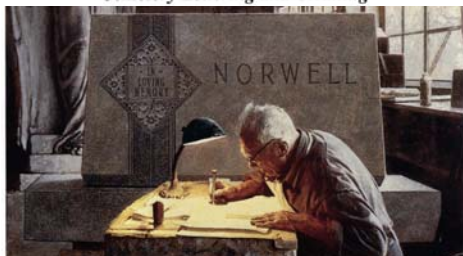
