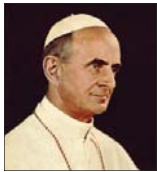

LA SALETTE MISSIONS: MISSIONARY CO- OPERATIVE APPEAL

This Sunday we welcome a Missionary Priest from the La Salette Fathers to make a Mission Appeal on behalf of his congregation. Each year the parishes receive an assigned visit from a missionary as part of the Archdiocesan Missionary Co-operative Appeal. Our Second Collection today is for this Mission Appeal.

RETURN OF THE “SUNDAY OBLIGATION” IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF BOSTON

Today marks the return of the so-called “Sunday Obligation” for Catholics in the Archdiocese of Boston, restored by our Archbishop Cardinal Seán after he had suspended it last March at the onset of the COVID-19 Pandemic. For faithful Catholics this restoration should be cause for joy. The coming together of Catholic Christians for Sunday Mass each week is one of the hallmarks of our Catholic identity.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* has some beautiful, clear teaching on the meaning of the Sunday Eucharist and its attendant “Sunday Obligation”. For example, we read:

The Sunday celebration of the Lord's Day and His Eucharist is at the heart of the Church's life. 'Sunday is the day on which the Paschal Mystery is celebrated in light of the Apostolic Tradition and is to be observed as the foremost holy day of obligation in the universal Church.'

(CCC, PAR. 2177)

This practice of the Christian assembly dates from the beginning of the Apostolic Age. The Letter to the Hebrews reminds the faithful 'not to neglect to meet together, as is the habit of some, but to encourage one another.' (Heb. 10:25)

(CCC, PAR 2178)

St. John Chrysostom says:

You cannot pray at home as at church, where there is a great multitude, where exclamations are cried out to God as from one great heart, and where there is something more: the union of minds, the accord of souls, the bond of charity, the prayers of the priests.

(CCC, PAR 2179)

The Sunday Obligation itself is a positive law of the Church, well-defined by the Church:

The Precept of the Church specifies the law of the Lord more precisely: 'On Sundays and other Holy Days of Obligation the faithful are bound to participate in the Mass.' 'The precept of participating in the Mass is satisfied by assistance at a Mass which is celebrated anywhere in a Catholic rite either on the Holy Day or on the evening of the preceding day.'

(CCC, PAR 2180)

There are a good many reasons why a faithful Catholic may be dispensed from this Sunday Obligation, either on occasion (e.g., one is feeling sick) or for a more prolonged period of time (e.g., one is housebound and unable to get to Mass without assistance) but a faithful Catholic is not free to devise his own version of the Sunday Obligation (watching the Mass on TV or on-line does *not* fulfill it.) Let us re-commit ourselves to the dutiful observance of the Sunday Obligation.

CONGRATULATIONS TO DEACON SERMED ASHKOURI

Last Sunday, the Deacon at our 9 AM Mass was newly-ordained Deacon Served Ashkouri. Served was ordained to the Permanent Diaconate by Cardinal Sean on Easter Saturday, April 10th, 2021, with faculties to serve as Deacon both in the Roman(Latin)-rite and the Chaldean-rite of his native Iraq. Deacon Served and his wife Assil were lay-leaders of the Iraqi Catholic Community while their Mission was here at Mary Immaculate of Lourdes (2012-2019). As an ordained Deacon he has new pastoral-care responsibilities for the growing Community now re-located to St. Anne's Church in Wayland. “Principal Violist of Boston Baroque, Jason Fisher is a frequent guest with Handel & Hayden Society, the Seattle and Portland Baroque Orchestras, Byron Schenkman & Friends, Gut Reaction, Oregon Bach Festival, Connecticut Early Music Festival, and Aston Magna Music Festival.

On modern viola, Jason is a founding member of the Grammy-nominated string orchestra A Far Cry. A Carnegie Hall Fellow and a Peabody Singapore Fellow, he has toured Europe, Asia, Kazakhstan, and the Kyrgyz Republic. Concerts at Vienna Musikverein, Singapore Esplanade, and Carnegie Hall. Performances with Pink Martini, Jake Shimabukuro, Itzhak Perlman, Yo-Yo Ma, Renée Fleming, Kiri Te Kanawa, and with members of the Florestan Trio, and the Aeolus, Brentano, Cleveland, Emerson, Mendelssohn, and St. Lawrence String Quartets.”

NOTES ON *UT QUEANT LAXIS*

“Paul the Deacon, a monk of Monte Casino and a friend of Charlemagne, had composed, in honour of St. John the Baptist, the hymn: ‘Ut queant laxis’ (‘Free from guilt your servants’ unclean lips, holy John...’)

In the 13th Century the Benedictine monk Guy of Arezzo noticed that the notes sung on the first syllables formed the sequence of the first six degrees of the scale. He named each degree by the corresponding syllable: ‘Ut, re, mi, fa, sol, la, si’ and thereby greatly facilitated the study of musical intervals.

(St. Andrew’s Missal note, 1952 edition)

*Ut queant laxis resonare fibris (Do-re)
Mira gestorum famuli tuorum (mi-fa)
Solve pollute labii reatum (Sol-la)
Sisancte Ioannes (Si)*

LATIN MASS PROPERS: FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: *Psalm 26: 1, 2* The Lord is my light and my salvation: whom shall I fear? The Lord is the protector of my life: of whom shall I be afraid? My enemies that trouble me have themselves been weakened and have fallen. *Psalm 26: 3* If armies in camp should stand together against me, my heart shall not fear. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT Grant, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that the course of this world may be so peaceably ordered by Thee, that Thy Church may joyfully serve Thee in quiet devotion. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: *Romans 8: 18-23* Brethren, I reckon that the sufferings of this time are not worthy to be compared with the glory to come, that shall be revealed in us. For the expectation of the creature waiteth for the revelation of the sons of God. For the creature was made subject to vanity, not willingly, but by reason of Him that made it subject in hope; because the creature also itself shall be delivered from the servitude of corruption, into the liberty of the glory of the children of God. For we know that every creature groaneth, and travaileth in pain, even till now; and not only it, but ourselves also, who have the first-fruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting for the adoption of the sons of God, the redemption of our body; in Christ Jesus our Lord.

GRADUAL: *Psalm 78: 9, 10* Forgive us our sins, O Lord, lest the Gentiles should at any time say: Where is their God? *V.* Help us, O God, our Saviour; and for the honour of Thy name, O Lord, deliver us. **ALLELUIA:** *Psalm 9: 5, 10* Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* O God, who sittest upon the throne, and judgest justice, be Thou the refuge of the poor in tribulation. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Luke 5: 1-11* **At** that time, when the multitudes pressed upon Jesus to hear the word of God, He stood by the lake of Genesareth. And He saw two ships standing by the lake; but the fishermen were gone out of them, and were washing their nets; and going up into one of the ships that was Simon's, He desired him to draw back a little from the land: and sitting He taught the multitudes out of the ship. Now when He had ceased to speak, He said to Simon: Launch out into the deep, and let down your nets for a draught. And Simon, answering, said to Him: Master, we have laboured all the night, and have taken nothing, but at Thy word I will let down the net. And when they had done this, they enclosed a very great multitude of fishes; and their net broke: and they beckoned to their partners that were in the other ship, that they should come and help them; and they came, and filled both the ships, so that they were almost sinking. Which when Simon Peter saw, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying: Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord. For he was wholly astonished, and all that were with him, at the draught of fishes which they had taken: and so were also James and John the sons of Zebedee, who were Simon's partners. And Jesus saith to Simon: Fear not, from henceforth thou shalt catch men. And having brought their ships to land, leaving all things they followed Him.

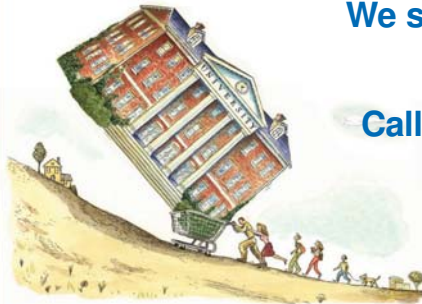

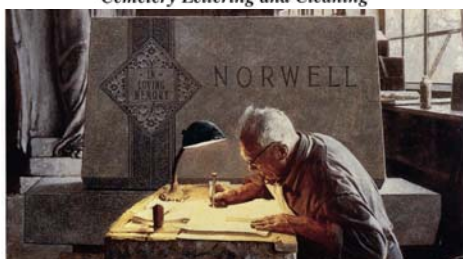
