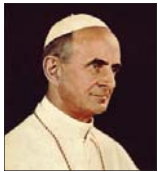

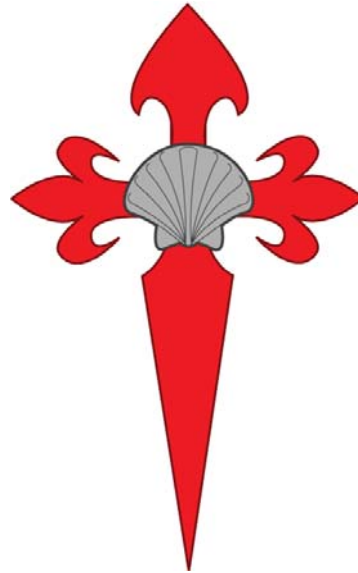
THE FRANCIS MOTU PROPIO: THE DAY AFTER...

On July 16th, Our Holy Father Pope Francis promulgated an Apostolic Letter issued Motu Proprio (that is, issued on the Pope's own authority) *Traditiones Custodes* ("Guardians of Tradition") which at once: 1) Declared the Pauline Reform Missal to be the "unique expression of the *lex orandi* of the Roman Rite", thereby officially abrogating the Tridentine Mass which had not been done when Pope Paul VI promulgated his reform in 1970. 2) Abrogated and nullified all of the provisions contained in Pope Benedict XVI's 2007 Motu Proprio *Summorum Pontificum*. 3) Imposed severe restrictions on the celebration of the Latin Mass for the present and set forth a template for the suppression of the Latin Mass altogether in the not too distant future.

Commenting on this Motu Proprio in *First Things*, McGill University Theology Professor Douglas Farrow made the following observations:

*It is rumored that earlier drafts were less charitable than the final documents. Yet the measures are draconian and the tone, though dignified, remains severe. To make matters worse, Francis has assigned to diocesan bishops the difficult task of suppression while reserving to Rome the right to veto particular acts of clemency, including (at Article 4) any permission granted new ordinands (newly-ordained priests) to say the Latin Mass. For this, few of his brethren will thank him. Some, who themselves love and respect the *Vetus Ordo*, will resist him. ("Pope Francis and the Tridentine Mass", *First Things*, July 18th, 2021)*

Gerhard Cardinal Müller, the former Prefect for the Congregation of the Doctrine of the Faith, has characterized the Francis Motu Proprio as,

*"a harsh disciplining of the old ritual minority." In his critique, published in English by *The Catholic Thing*, Cardinal Müller went on to say:*

The [Motu Proprio's] clear intent is to condemn the Extraordinary Form to extinction in the long run ... Without the slightest empathy, one ignores the religious feelings of the (often young) participants in the Mass according to the Missal John XXIII (1962). Instead of appreciating the smell of the sheep, the shepherd here hits them hard with his crook ...

... A little more knowledge of Catholic dogmatics and the history of the liturgy could counteract the unfortunate formation of opposing parties and also save the Bishops from the temptation to act in an authoritarian, loveless and narrow-minded manner against the supporters of the "old" Mass Bishops are appointed as shepherds by the Holy Spirit, not merely representatives of a Central Office—with opportunities for advancement ... The good shepherd can be recognized by the fact that he worries more about the salvation of souls than recommending himself to a higher authority by subservient 'good behavior'. If the law of non-contradiction still applies, one cannot logically castigate careerism in the Church and at the same time promote careerists ...

... Let us hope that the Congregations for Religious and for Divine Worship, with their new authority, do not become inebriated by power and think they have to wage a campaign of destruction against the communities of the Old Rite—in the foolish belief that by doing so they are rendering a service to the Church and promoting Vatican II.

Fortunately for us, we do have a good shepherd as described by Cardinal Müller as our Archbishop here in Boston. In the wake of the Francis Motu Proprio, Cardinal Seán has sought to re-assure us and has announced that, for now, he will make no changes in his Archdiocese regarding the celebration of the Latin Mass.

LATIN MASS PROPERS: NINTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: Psalm 53: 6-7 Behold God is my helper, and the Lord is the protector of my soul: turn back the evils upon my enemies, and cut them off in Thy truth, O Lord my protector. Psalm 53: 3 Save me, O God, by Thy name, and deliver me in Thy strength. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT: Let Thy merciful ears, O Lord, be open to the prayers of Thy suppliant people; and that Thou mayest grant them their petitions, make them to ask such things as shall please Thee. Through Our Lord.

EPISTLE: 1 Corinthians 10: 6-13 Brethren, let us not covet evil things, as they also coveted. Neither become ye idolaters, as some of them: as it is written: The people sat down to eat and drink, and rose up to play. Neither let us commit fornication, as some of them committed fornication, and there fell in one day three and twenty thousand. Neither let us tempt Christ, as some of them tempted, and perished by the serpents. Neither do you murmur, as some of them murmured, and were destroyed by the destroyer. Now all these things happened to them in figure, and they are written for our correction, upon whom the ends of the world are come. Wherefore he that thinketh himself to stand, let him take heed lest he fall. Let no temptation take hold on you, but such as is human: and God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that which you are able; but will make also with temptation issue, that you may be able to bear it.

GRADUAL: Psalm 8: 2 O Lord our Lord, how admirable is Thy name in the whole earth! V. For Thy magnificence is elevated above the heavens. **ALLELUIA:** Psalm 58: 2 Alleluia, alleluia. V. Deliver me from my enemies, O my God: and defend me from them that rise up against me. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Luke 19: 41-47 *At that time, when Jesus drew near to Jerusalem, seeing the city, He wept over it saying: If thou also hadst known, and that in this day, the things that are to thy peace: but now they are hidden from thy eyes. For the days shall come upon thee, and thy enemies shall cast a trench about thee, and compass thee round, and straiten thee on every side; and beat thee flat to the ground, and thy children who are in thee; and they shall not leave in thee a stone upon a stone, because thou hast not known the time of thy visitation. And entering into the temple, He began to cast out them that sold therein, and them that bought, saying to them: It is written, My house is the house of prayer, but you have made it a den of thieves. And He was teaching daily in the temple.*

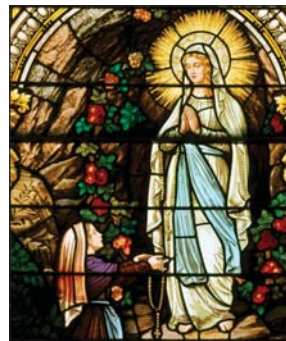
