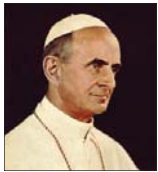

THE "AGATHA CHRISTIE INDULT"

When Pope Paul VI promulgated his *Novus Ordo Missae* (New Order of Mass) in 1970 the so-called Tridentine

Mass (the Missal which came out of the reforms of the Council of Trent and was promulgated by Pope Pius V) was superseded. For all practical purposes the Old Mass "went out of business". Concession was made for older priests for whom learning a whole new Order of Mass might be unduly burdensome. They could continue to celebrate the Tridentine Mass privately. Otherwise there was no official space in the post-Vatican II Church for what has come to be known as the "Traditional Latin Mass". Except in one case: a special Indult was granted to the Bishops of England and Wales to allow the continuance of the pre-conciliar Tridentine Mass in their jurisdictions. This Indult also had the nickname, the "Agatha Christie Indult".

According to the story, when it became known that Pope Paul was going to radically re-configure the Roman Catholic Mass, a petition was drawn up in England, signed by prominent personages both Catholic and non-Catholic, to plead the case for continuing the existence of the old Latin Mass as part of the patrimony of Western Civilization. One of the prominent personages was the mystery-writer Agatha Christie. As Pope Paul was reading the list of signatories he was startled and exclaimed, "Oh!—Miss Christie!". He was, you see, one of her fans. The subsequent papal concession for the Latin Mass to continue in England and Wales therefore acquired the tag-name, the "Agatha Christie Indult".

In light of Pope Francis's *Motu Proprio* against the Latin Mass I think it is important to re-visit this issue of the Mass as part of the patrimony of Western Civilization. From the time of Pope St Gregory the Great in the 6th Century A.D. until

the definitive promulgation of Paul VI's *Novus Ordo* in 1970, the Roman-rite of Mass, offered in the Latin language, was a center-piece of the whole civilization of the "West". Both in the high cultural achievements of sacred art and music and in the ways in which "the Mass" became embedded in ordinary people's experience, the Mass shaped a world.

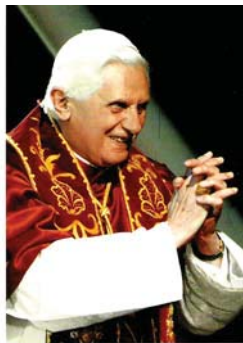
It was therefore a very sound instinct that led the signers of that British petition to Pope Paul to make the case for a continuation of the old Latin Mass as part of the patrimony not just of Catholics but, in a sense, of all humanity. What would we think of a top-down order which decreed that the music of great composers like Bach or Mozart should no longer be publicly performed, and that music students should not be taught to play them, because they were deemed harmful to contemporary music developments? Or, what would we think if great paintings were removed from museums and put away in storage forever so that only artists after a certain recent date could be exhibited? We would see such top-down orders as monumental and terrible acts of cultural destruction, wouldn't we? Just so, we should consider Pope Francis's plan for the suppression of the Latin Mass, expunging it even from the collective memory of Catholics. According to the mind of his *Motu Proprio*, Catholic Liturgy dates from 1970. Everything else prior belongs to the "Before Times", which now do not matter.

Catholic peoples, clergy and lay-faithful alike, have a right to raise a *cri de coeur* in protest against this *Motu Proprio*, both in its letter and in its spirit. And not only Catholics: non-Catholics too, who have an appreciation of the old Latin Mass's place in the civilization of the West: they have a right to lament a loss to the common patrimony of all.

It would be a sad thing indeed if the Latin Mass became a thing only to be encountered by scholar specialists or seen as part of the décor in period-piece feature films.

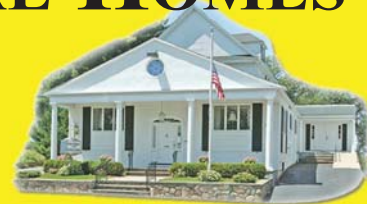

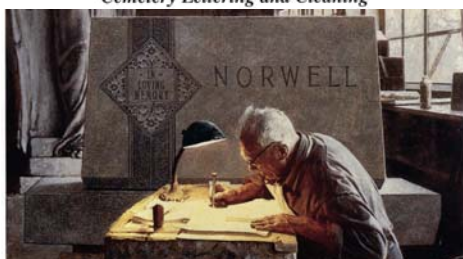
