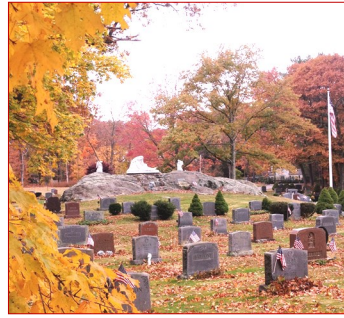

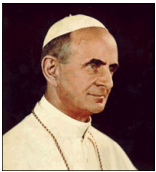

Pastor's Note

RESPECT LIFE SUNDAY

We attach the name "Respect Life Sunday" to this First Sunday of October which continues on in spirit

throughout the month. The designator is a reminder to us of the witness we are supposed to bear as Catholics to the intrinsic dignity of human life: to witness to what the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* says in Paragraph 2258:

Human life is sacred because from its beginnings it involves the creative action of God, and it remains for ever in a special relationship with the Creator, who is its sole end. God alone is the Lord of life from its beginning until its end: no one can under any circumstance claim for himself the right directly to destroy an innocent human being.

This is a monumental statement of principle. It cannot be lived up to without real conviction and personal struggle. While it gives great clarity on complicated moral issues which are much contested in today's world it hardly makes things easy.

As we know, moral relativism is the default-mode of contemporary moral reasoning. We may summarize it as: *"It is wrong to do such-and-such...unless you really need to."* Pope-emeritus Pope Benedict once called it the "dictatorship of relativism". We are certainly not the first generation who have gone in for rational excuse-making for evil deeds. Nonetheless, there does seem to be more justification for it in theory as a sign of human progress. Negative reaction to Catholic positions on the Life-issues of abortion, euthanasia and assisted-suicide are prominent examples. We are not allowed to talk about whether something is good or evil in itself: what matters is only the freedom of an individual person to choose. Ironically, as a society we are "absolute" in our moral relativism!

St. Margaret of Castello, canonized by Pope Francis during Paschaltide of this year, is a patroness saint of Pro-life groups, as well as of those who experience being unwanted or abandoned. In her story, we are horrified by the cruelty of her parents who, on account of her physical deformities, rejected her, walled her up in a room beginning at six years of age, and then abandoned her outside a shrine at 15 when God did not miraculously cure her of all these handicaps.

But how would these parents be viewed by a lot of people in today's morally-relativistic America if, based on pre-natal testing, they had aborted her or, after her birth, seeing how badly off she was, refused the necessary medical interventions to save her life and let her languish and die instead? Would not all the sympathy be with the parents, especially the mother? Would we not hear?: *"It would have been cruel to bring such a child into the world. She would have had no quality of life."* Thus killing the unborn child should be credited to the parents as an act of love. And finally: *"The decision of a woman is not to be questioned."* These are not fanciful as these are precisely the kind of justifications which are used in the abortion debate today.



It is certainly true that we should not trivialize the sufferings of others which lead them to conclude that they must do something evil in-and-of-itself like directly destroy the life of an innocent human being through feticide. Parents of ordinary means or little means who have children with severe special needs face great hardships, given how limited the networks of social support really are in this country.

Living the “pro-life” message requires sacrifices of everyone in various ways and none of us should dare dispense himself from them.

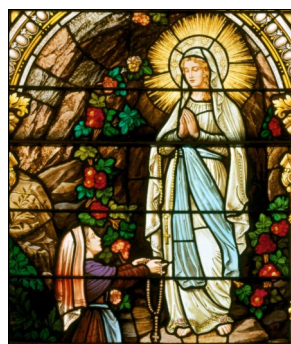

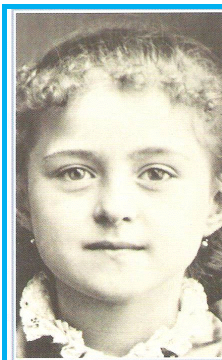

LATIN MASS PROPERS: OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY

INTROIT: Let us all rejoice in the Lord, celebrating a festival-day in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, for whose solemn festival the Angels rejoice and give praise to the Son of God. *Psalm 44:2* My heart hath uttered a good word: I speak my works to the King V. Glory be to the Father...

COLLECT: O God, whose only-begotten Son by His Life and death and resurrection has won for us the rewards of eternal salvation, grant, we pray, that we who meditate on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: *Proverbs 8: 22-24, 32-35* The Lord possessed me in the beginning of His ways, before He made anything, from the beginning. I was set up from eternity, and of old, before the earth was made. The depths were not as yet, and I was already conceived. Now therefore, ye children, hear me: blessed are they that keep my ways. Hear instruction, and be wise, and refuse it not. Blessed is the man that heareth me, and that watcheth daily at my gates; and waiteth at the posts of my doors. He that shall find me, shall find life, and shall have salvation from the Lord.

GRADUAL: *Psalm 44:5, 11, 12* Because of truth, and meekness, and justice: and thy right hand shall conduct thee wonderfully. V. Hearken, O daughter, and see, and incline thine ear, for the King hath greatly desired thy beauty. **ALLELUIA:** Alleluia, alleluia. V. The solemn festival of the glorious Virgin Mary of the seed of Abraham, sprung from the tribe of Judah, of David's royal race. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Luke 1:26-38* At that time, the Angel Gabriel was sent from God into a city of Galilee, called Nazareth, to a virgin espoused to a man whose name was Joseph, of the House of David: and the virgin's name was Mary. And the angel being come in, said unto her: Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with thee: blessed art thou among women. Who, having heard, was troubled at his saying and thought with herself what manner of salutation this should be. And the angel said to her: Fear not, Mary, for thou hast found grace with God. Behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb and shalt bring forth a Son: and thou shalt call His name Jesus. He shall be great and shall be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God shall give unto Him the throne of David His Father: and He shall reign in the House of Jacob forever, and of His Kingdom there shall be no end. And Mary said to the angel: How shall this be done since I know not man? And the angel answering, said to her: The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee and the power of the Most High shall overshadow thee. And therefore also the Holy which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God. And behold thy cousin Elizabeth, she also hath conceived a son in her old age: and this is the sixth month with her that is called barren; because no word shall be impossible with God. And Mary said: Behold the handmaid of the Lord, be it done to me according to thy word.

OFFERTORY: *Ecclus. 24: 25; 39:17* In me is all grace of the way and of the truth; in me is all hope of life and of virtue. Like a rose planted on the rivers I have budded forth.

SECRET Make us worthy, O Lord, we beseech Thee, to offer Thee this sacrifice; and by means of the mysteries of the most holy Rosary may we so keep in mind the life, passion and glory of Thine only-begotten Son, that we may be made worthy of His promises. Who with Thee liveth.

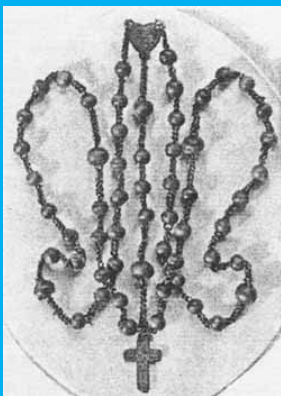

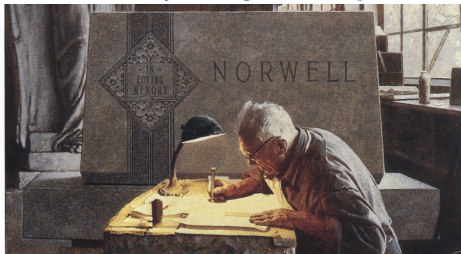
