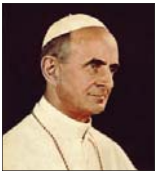

Pastor's Note

THE DIVINE MATERNITY OF MARY

In 1931, as a way to mark the 1,500th Anniversary of the dogmatic proclamation of Mary as *Theotokos* (literally, the “God-bearer”), the “Mother of God” at the Church Council of Ephesus, A.D. 431, Pope Pius XI instituted a new liturgical feast “*The Motherhood of the Blessed Virgin Mary*” which was to be celebrated on October 11th.

The doctrinal mystery highlighted touches upon Our Lady’s Motherhood in relation to all the members of Christ’s Mystical Body in the Church. As one Missal note explains it:

Mary is the Mother of Jesus, the Son of God; He is her Son because she gave Him flesh and blood. He became incarnate in her. We honor Our Lady, therefore, as Mother of Our Lord; but we love her too as our own Mother in our life of grace, for she gave us this life in giving us the Author of life. (St. Andrew Missal, ed. 1961)

Pius XI, his Encyclical *Ad diem illum* says:



All of us who are united to Christ and members of His Body were born of Mary with our Head. She is Mother of us all, spiritually, but truly Mother of the members of Christ.

In our Catholic belief then we recognize how Mary made use of her dignity to take an active part in the redemption of mankind and to contribute to the glory of God. This participation was not compressed solely into the historical time frame of Mary’s earthly life but is on-going as it has been elevated to the eternal plane.

Pope John XXIII chose October 11th, 1962, the Feast of the Motherhood of God, as the opening day for the Second Vatican Council very deliberately in order to emphasize the



connection between Mary’s intercessory role and the anticipated work of the Council. We see this manifested also in Pope John’s pilgrimage to the Holy House of Loreto just before the Council’s opening.

As they formed the shape of a Cross with their torches Pope John XXIII unexpectedly opened his window and made an informal address to the crowds below.

This Marian *leitmotif* of the Second Vatican Council was continued when Pope John’s successor, Pope Paul VI, bestowed upon Mary a new title at the conclusion of the Second Vatican Council on December 8th, 1965. That title: *Mary, Mother of the Church (Maria Mater Ecclesiae)*.

In the liturgical calendar reform of 1970 the Octave Day of Christmas, January 1st, was chosen as the best day to highlight the Mystery of Mary’s Divine Maternity. The October 11th feast was removed. Upon Pope John XXIII’s canonization, however, this day of October 11th was chosen as an especially appropriate day to honor his memory and recognize his crown of glory.

Symbol of St. Luke the Evangelist (Feast Day, October 18th). The action of St. Luke's Gospel begins with the vision of St. Zachary, John the Baptist's father, in the Temple at Jerusalem where the sin-offering animal sacrifices took place. It is to St. Luke's Gospel, Chapters One and Two, that we owe the precious details of Christ's Birth and Infancy, details which could only have come from Mary's own disclosures.

LATIN MASS PROPERS: THE TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: *Esther 13: 9, 10-11* All things are in Thy will, O Lord; and there is none that can resist Thy will: for Thou hast made all things, heaven and earth, and all things that are under the cope of heaven: Thou art Lord of all. *Psalm 118: 1* Blessed are the undefiled in the way; who walk in the law of the Lord. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT Lord, we pray Thee, keep Thy household the Church in continual godliness; that through Thy protection it may be free from all adversities, and devoutly given to good works, to the glory of Thy holy name. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: *Ephesians 6: 10-17* Brethren: Be strengthened in the Lord, and in the might of His power. Put you on the armour of God, that you may be able to stand against the deceits of the devil. For our wrestling is not against flesh and blood, but against principalities and powers, against the rulers of the world of this darkness, against the spirits of wickedness in the high places. Therefore, take unto you the armour of God, that you may be able to resist in the evil day, and to stand in all things perfect; stand therefore having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of justice, and your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace; in all things taking the shield of faith, wherewith you may be able to extinguish all the fiery darts of the most wicked one. And take unto you the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit which is the word of God.

GRADUAL: *Psalm 89: 1-2* Lord, Thou hast been our refuge from generation to generation. *V.* Before the mountains were made, or the earth and the world was formed; from eternity and to eternity Thou art God.

ALLELUIA: *Psalm 113: 1* Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* When Israel went out of Egypt, the house of Jacob from a barbarous people. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Matthew 18: 23-35* **At** that time Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: The kingdom of Heaven is likened to a king, who would take an account of his servants. And when he had begun to take the account, one was brought to him that owed him ten thousand talents: and as he had not wherewith to pay it, his lord commanded that he should be sold, and his wife and children, and all that he had, and payment to be made. But that servant falling down, besought him saying: Have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. And the lord of that servant, being moved with pity, let him go, and forgave him the debt. But when that servant was gone out, he found one of his fellow-servants that owed him a hundred pence: and laying hold of him, he throttled him, saying: Pay what thou owest. And his fellow-servant falling down besought him, saying: Have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. And he would not; but went and cast him into prison till he paid the debt. Now his fellow-servants, seeing what was done, were very much grieved; and they came and told their lord all that was done. Then his lord called him, and saith to him: Thou wicked servant, I forgave thee all the debt, because thou besougest me; shouldst not thou then have had compassion also on thy fellow-servant, even as I had compassion on thee? And his lord being angry delivered him to the torturers until he paid all the debt. So also shall my heavenly Father do to you, if you forgive not every one his brother from your hearts.

OFFERTORY: *Job 1: 2* There was a man in the land of Hus, whose name was Job, simple, and upright, and fearing God: whom Satan besought that he might tempt: and power was given him from the Lord over his possessions and his flesh; and he destroyed all his substance and his children; and wounded his flesh also with a grievous ulcer.

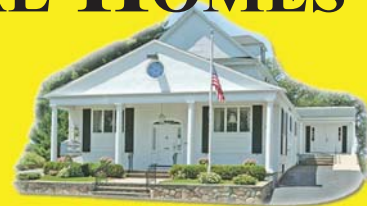

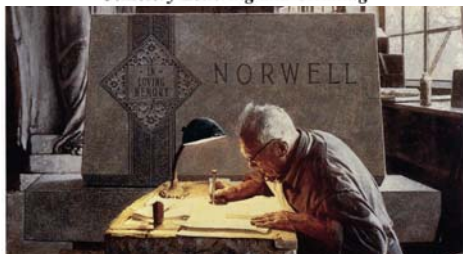
