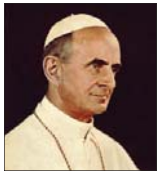

Pastor's Note



THE MONTH OF OUR LADY OF SORROWS AND PIUS VII

The designation of Our Lady of Sorrows as the chief devotion for the month of September has its

poignant origins in the tribulation of the Roman Catholic Church during the reign of Pope Pius VII.

In 1809, a few months after the Pope had erected the new diocese of Boston in the mission territory of the United States of America, Napoleon Bonaparte annexed Rome to his French

Empire. The Pope was arrested and deported to Paris. From 1809-1814 the governance of the Church from the Apostolic See lay in a state of suspension. When Pius VII was at last able to return to Rome in the wake of Napoleon's defeat, he instituted a new liturgical feast to be observed on the third Sunday of September: a second feast of the Seven Sorrows of Mary (the first being on Passion Friday, before Holy Week.) He saw it as a fitting that the Church should have a new memorial of Mt. Calvary, since the Church had just undergone a long experience of Calvary. This Seven Sorrows Sunday remained in place until the liturgical reform movement introduced other changes in the 20th Century. But it is good for us to be aware of the historical background.

Pope Pius VII demonstrated mercy and forgiveness towards Napoleon and his family after their downfall. He gladly offered refuge

in Rome to members of Napoleon's family, including Napoleon's mother. When it was reported to him the severe conditions of Napoleon's exile on the island of St. Helena, Pius asked his Secretary of State Cardinal Consalvi to plead for leniency with the Prince-Regent of England. And when it was reported to him that Napoleon wished to see a priest, the Pope sent him a chaplain to his desolate, far-away place of exile. In that way, Napoleon Bonaparte, who in the days of his power had been seen by some as the Anti-Christ, died a son of the Catholic Church.

BEATIFICATION OF THE "SEPTEMBER POPE"



On September 4th, Pope Francis declared Pope John Paul I a "blessed" of the Catholic Church. Albino Cardinal Luciani, the Patriarch of Venice, was elected to the Papacy on August 26th, 1978,

as the successor to Pope Paul VI, who had died on August 6th of that year. He reigned for only 33-days before his sudden death on September 28th. This week we mark the 44th Anniversary of his death. A second conclave elected Karol Cardinal Wojtyla of Krakow, Poland, and he was installed as Pope John Paul II on October 22nd, 1978. Thus the year 1978 was the Year of Three Popes. It is not for his brief reign as the "September Pope" for which he has been beatified but for proof of a worthy Christian life preceding his elevation to the See of Peter and on the evidence of a miracle in answer to prayers made for his intercession. Let us give praise and thanks to God for the way He is glorified in His Saints.

Then shalt thou have glory before them that sit at table with thee: because every one that exalteth himself, shall be humbled; and he that humbleth himself, shall be exalted. —
