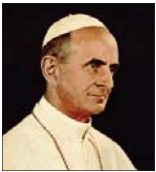

“JUDITHA” and OUR LADY

One of the important biblical “types” of Our Lady is the virtuous and beautiful widow Judith of the Old Testament Book of Judith. In this story she risks her life in order to save her city from destruction by the powerful Assyrian army. Taking her maid with her, she pretends to defect to the enemy camp. Holofernes, the enemy commander is charmed by her. On the fourth day, she is alone with him in his tent and he has drunk himself into a stupor. Judith beheads him and makes her escape back to the Israelite camp. The enemy, upon discovering their leader killed, panics and flees. Thus the city is saved by Judith, and the people all sing her praises. The Catholic Church in her liturgy sees Judith and Holofernes as figures of the

Protoevangelium of Genesis 3:15: “I will put enmities between thee (i.e. the serpent-devil) and the woman, and thy seed and her seed: She shall crush thy head, and thou shalt lie in wait for her heel.” Judith is like Mary, and Holofernes like Satan. For this reason, the praises of the people for Judith find their way into the Masses for the Immaculate Conception and the Assumption, as praises applied by the People of God to Mary, the handmaid of the Lord: “*Thou art the glory of Jerusalem, thou art the joy of Israel, thou art the honor of our people.*” (*Judith 13*)

LATIN MASS PROPERS: FIFTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: Psalm 85. 1, 2, 3. **INCLINE** Thine ear, O Lord, to me and hear me: save Thy servant, O my God, that trusteth in Thee: have mercy on me, O Lord, for I have cried to Thee all the day. *Ps. ibid.* 4. Give joy to the soul of Thy Servant; for to Thee, O Lord, I have lifted up my soul. *V.* Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — Incline Thine ear, O Lord ...

COLLECT LET Thy continual pity, O Lord, cleanse and defend Thy Church: and because it cannot continue in safety without Thee, may it ever be governed by Thy goodness. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: From the Letter of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Galatians, 5. 25-26; 6. 1-10. **BRETHREN:** If we live in the spirit, let us also walk in the spirit. Let us not be made desirous of vainglory, provoking one another, envying one another. Brethren, and if a man be overtaken in any fault, you, who are spiritual, instruct such a one in the spirit of meekness, considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted. Bear ye one another's burdens, and so you shall fulfill the law of Christ. For if any man think himself to be something, whereas he is nothing, he deceiveth himself. But let everyone prove his own work, and so he shall have glory in himself only, and not in another. For every one shall bear his own burden. And let him that is instructed in the word, communicate to him that instructeth him, in all good things. Be not deceived, God is not mocked; for what things a man shall sow, those also shall he reap. For he that soweth in his flesh, of the flesh also shall reap corruption: but he that soweth in the spirit, of the spirit shall reap life everlasting. And in doing good, let us not fail; for in due time we shall reap, not failing. Therefore, whilst we have time, let us work good to all men, but especially to those who are of the household of the faith.

GRADUAL: Psalm 91. 2-3. **IT** is good to give praise to the Lord; and to sing to Thy Name, O most High. To show forth Thy mercy in the morning, and Thy truth in the night. **ALLELUIA:** Psalm 94. 3. Alleluia, Alleluia. For the Lord is a great God, and a great King over all the earth. Alleluia.



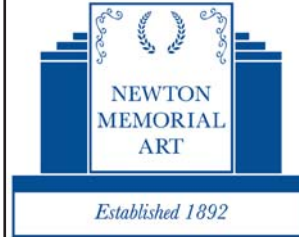

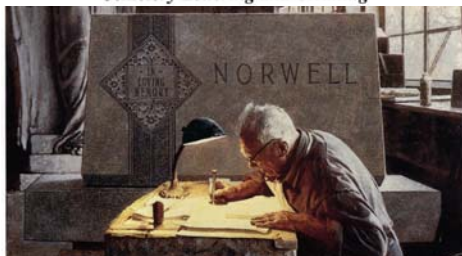
