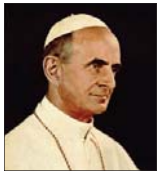

THE TWO FEASTS OF SAINT AGNES: JANUARY 21st JANUARY 28th

Among the late Christmas feasts on the Sanctoral Calendar of the Roman Church we find the two feasts of St. Agnes, Virgin-Martyr. She was but a girl of twelve years when she was subjected to horrific tortures and public humiliation before being put to death for the crime of being a Christian. Her martyrdom took place during the years of the Great Persecution under Diocletian at the beginning of the 4th Century A.D. The memory of her passion was still fresh in the minds of the Catholic people when St. Ambrose spoke these words decades later:

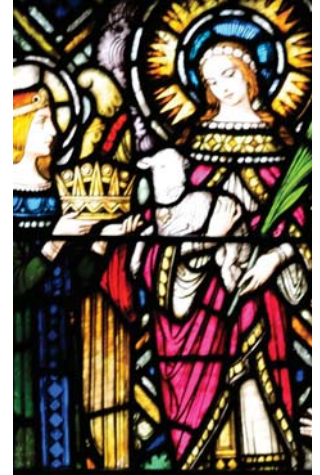
All were weeping but she was dry-eyed. Everyone marveled that she was so spendthrift with her life, which she had hardly tasted, but was now giving up as though she had finished with it. All were astounded that she should come forward as a witness to the Godhead, when she was still too young to be her own mistress. It was her final achievement, that men believed that she had received from God what could not come from man; for what is beyond nature comes from the Author of nature.

The martyrdom of St. Agnes is January 21st. The Second Feast of St. Agnes on January 28th recalls the vision of her in Heaven which her parents received as a consolation and assurance.

It was the eight day since her martyrdom. Whilst they were thinking upon the cruel death, which, though it had enriched their child with a Martyr's palm, had deprived them of her society, Agnes suddenly appeared to them: she was encircled with a bright light, and wore a crown on her head, and was surrounded by a choir of virgins of dazzling beauty. On her

right hand there stood a beautiful white lamb, the emblem of the Divine Spouse of Agnes. Turning towards her parents, she said to them: Weep not over my death: for I am now in Heaven, together with these virgins, living with Him whom I loved on earth with my whole soul.

This vision of Agnes with the Divine Lamb and her very name which is so close to the Latin word for lamb, *agnus*, identifies her with the meekness and innocence of life which comes from Christ Himself, the *Agnus Dei*, the Lamb of God Who takes away the sins of the world.



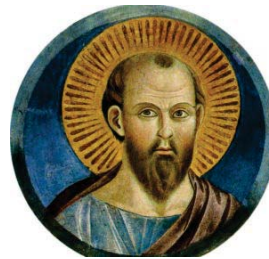

COLLECT: O almighty and everlasting God, look mercifully upon our weakness: and stretch forth the right hand of Thy Majesty to protect us. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son ...

EPISTLE: From Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Romans, 12. 16-21 Brethren: Be not wise in your own conceits. To no man rendering evil for evil: providing good things, not only in the sight of God, but also in the sight of all men. If it be possible, as much as is in you, have peace with all men. Revenge not yourselves, my dearly beloved, but give place unto wrath, for it is written: Revenge is mine: I will repay, saith the Lord. But if thine enemy be hungry, give him to eat: if he thirst, give him to drink: for doing this, thou shalt heap coals of fire upon his head. Be not overcome by evil, but overcome evil by good.

GOSPEL: Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Matthew 8. 1-13 At that time, when Jesus was come down from the mountain, great multitudes followed Him: and behold a leper came and adored Him, saying: Lord, if Thou wilt, Thou canst make me clean. And Jesus stretching forth His hand, touched him, saying: I will. Be thou made clean. And forthwith his leprosy was cleansed. And Jesus saith to him: See thou tell no man: but go, show thyself to the priest, and offer the gift which Moses commanded for a testimony unto them. And when he had entered into Capharnaum, there came to him a centurion, beseeching Him, and saying: Lord, my servant lieth at home sick of the palsy, and is grievously tormented. And Jesus saith to him: I will come and heal him. And the centurion making answer, said: Lord, I am not worthy that Thou shouldst enter under my roof: but only say the word, and my servant shall be healed. For I also am a man subject to authority, having under me soldiers; and I say to this one: go, and he goeth; and to another, Come, and he cometh; and to my servant: Do this, and he doeth it. And Jesus hearing this, marveled, and said to them that followed Him: Amen I say to you, I have not found so great faith in Israel. And I say to you that many shall come from the east and the west, and shall sit down with Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven: but the children of the kingdom shall be cast out into the exterior darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. And Jesus said to the centurion: Go, and as thou hast believed, so be it done to thee. And the servant was healed at the same hour.

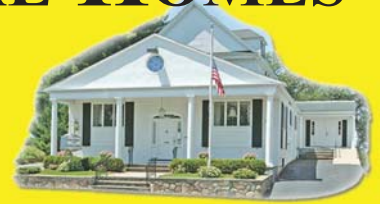

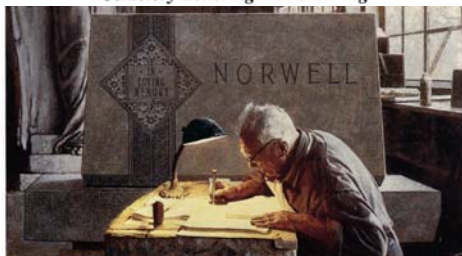
