The Brigittine/Carmelite Six-decade Rosary and the Apparition of the Blessed Virgin

Mary Immaculate at Lourdes

According to the Revelations made to St. Brigid of Sweden (+1373), Our Blessed Lady lived on this earth for 63 years. The six-decade Rosary of the Brigittine Order reflects this. With the introductory three Hail Mary's, 63 Hail Mary's are said, one for each year of Our Lady's earthly life. The seven Our Father's represent the Seven Joys and Sorrows of Our Lady. St. Teresa of Avila (+1582), during her reform of her Carmelite Order once visited a Brigittine House and introduced the practice of this six-decade Rosary for her Religious too.

When Our Lady first appeared to Bernadette on February 11th, 1858, she was carrying a six-decade Rosary. On March 25th, 1858, Our Lady finally gave her name to Bernadette: "I am the IMMACULATE CONCEPTION." In the Seven Days of Creation, according to the Book of Genesis, Adam and Eve are created on the Sixth Day. Thus the six-decade Rosary carries a mystical meaning of the New Creation of the world in Christ Jesus. Our Lord is the New and Second Adam: Mary, the Immaculate Conception, is the New and Second Eve.

Another significant fact is that the six-decade Rosary had long been prayed by the people in that region of France (the Pyrenees).





LATIN MASS PROPERS: NINETEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

EPISTLE: From the Letter of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Ephesians, 4. 23-28. Brethren: Be ye renewed in the spirit of your mind, and put on the new man, who according to God is created in justice and holiness of truth. Wherefore putting away lying, speak ye the truth every man with his neighbor, for we are members one of another. Be angry, and sin not. Let not the sun go down upon your anger. Give not place to the devil. He that stole, let him now steal no more; but rather let him labor, working with his hands the thing which is good, that he may have something to give to him that suffereth need.

GOSPEL: Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, 22. 1-14. **A**t that time, Jesus spoke to the chief priests and the pharisees in parables, saying: The Kingdom of heaven is likened to a king, who made a marriage for his son; and he sent his servants, to call them that were invited to the marriage, and they would not come. Again he sent other servants, saying: Tell them that were invited: Behold, I have prepared my dinner; my beeves and fattlings are killed, and all things are ready: come ye to the marriage. But they neglected: and went their ways, one to his farm, and another to his merchandise; and the rest laid hands on his servants, and having treated them contumeliously, put them to death. But when the king had heard of it, he was angry; and sending his armies, he destroyed those murderers, and burnt their city. Then he saith to his servants: The marriage indeed is ready, but they that were invited were not worthy. Go ye therefore into the highways, and as many as you shall find, call to the marriage. And his servants going forth into the ways, gathered together all that they found, both bad and good; and the marriage was filled with guests. 


