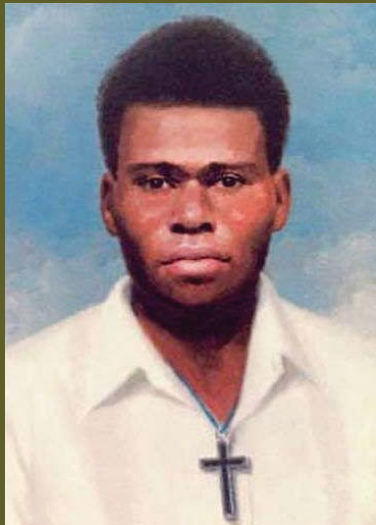

THE CHURCH'S NEWSEST SAINTS

Two Sunday's ago (October 19th), our Holy Father Pope Leo held the canonization Mass for seven Blesseds. The new Saints are: **St. Maria Rendiles Martinez**

(+1977), Foundress of the Congregation of the Servants of Jesus; **St. Jose Gregorio Hernandez Cisneros (+1919)**, known as the "Doctor of the Poor" for his charity. (These are the first two canonized Saints of Venezuela.); +**St. Ignatius Maloyan (+1915)**, Armenian Catholic Archbishop who was tortured and executed by the Ottoman Turks during their genocide of the Armenian Christians; **St. Peter To Rot (+1945)**, a lay Catechist from Papua New Guinea,

who was imprisoned by the Japanese occupiers and executed by them; **St. Vincenza Maria Poloni (+1855)**, Foundress of the Sisters of Mercy of Verona, Italy; **St. Maria Troncatti (+1969)**, a Salesian missionary Sister to Ecuador; and **St. Bartolo Longo (+1926)**, an Italian lawyer, who immersed himself in occult spiritual practices and went so far as to style himself a “satanic priest”. Nonetheless, in spite of his satanism, he somehow retained his boyhood love of the Blessed Virgin Mary and continued to recite a daily Rosary. One year to the day after his plunge into the darkness of occultism—May 29, 1865—he experienced a miraculous Catholic re-conversion which he attributed to Our Lady’s prayers. He dedicated the rest of his life to promoting the Rosary and founded the Shrine of Our Lady of Pompeii near the volcanic ruins of the ancient Roman city.

LATIN MASS PROPER: TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: *Esther 13: 9, 10-11* All things are in Thy will, O Lord; and there is none that can resist Thy will: for Thou hast made all things, heaven and earth, and all things that are under the cope of heaven: Thou art Lord of all. *Psalms 118: 1* Blessed are the undefiled in the way; who walk in the law of the Lord. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT Lord, we pray Thee, keep Thy household the Church in continual godliness; that through Thy protection it may be free from all adversities, and devoutly given to good works, to the glory of Thy holy name. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: *Ephesians 6: 10-17* Brethren: Be strengthened in the Lord, and in the might of His power. Put you on the armour of God, that you may be able to stand against the deceits of the devil. For our wrestling is not against flesh and blood, but against principalities and powers, against the rulers of the world of this darkness, against the spirits of wickedness in the high places. Therefore, take unto you the armour of God, that you may be able to resist in the evil day, and to stand in all things perfect; stand therefore having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of justice, and your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace; in all things taking the shield of faith, wherewith you may be able to extinguish all the fiery darts of the most wicked one. And take unto you the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit which is the word of God.

GRADUAL: *Psalms 89: 1-2* Lord, Thou hast been our refuge from generation to generation. V. Before the mountains were made, or the earth and the world was formed; from eternity and to eternity Thou art God.

ALLELUIA: *Psalms 113: 1* Alleluia, alleluia. V. When Israel went out of Egypt, the house of Jacob from a barbarous people. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Matthew 18: 23-35* At that time Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: The kingdom of Heaven is likened to a king, who would take an account of his servants. And when he had begun to take the account, one was brought to him that owed him ten thousand talents: and as he had not wherewith to pay it, his lord commanded that he should be sold, and his wife and children, and all that he had, and payment to be made. But that servant falling down, besought him saying: Have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. And the lord of that servant, being moved with pity, let him go, and forgave him the debt. But when that servant was gone out, he found one of his fellow-servants that owed him a hundred pence: and laying hold of him, he throttled him, saying: Pay what thou owest. And his fellow-servant falling down besought him, saying: Have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. And he would not; but went and cast him into prison till he paid the debt. Now his fellow-servants, seeing what was done, were very much grieved; and they came and told their lord all that was done. Then his lord called him, and saith to him: Thou wicked servant, I forgave thee all the debt, because thou besoughtest me; shouldst not thou then have had compassion also on thy fellow-servant, even as I had compassion on thee? And his lord being angry delivered him to the torturers until he paid all the debt. So also shall my heavenly Father do to you, if you forgive not every one his brother from your hearts.

OFFERTORY: *Job 1: 2* There was a man in the land of Hus, whose name was Job, simple, and upright, and fearing God: whom Satan besought that he might tempt: and power was given him from the Lord over his possessions and his flesh; and he destroyed all his substance and his children; and wounded his flesh also with a grievous ulcer.

SECRET Graciously receive, O Lord, this holy offering, by which Thou hast willed to be Thyself appeased: and in Thy powerful mercy restore salvation unto us. Through Our Lord.

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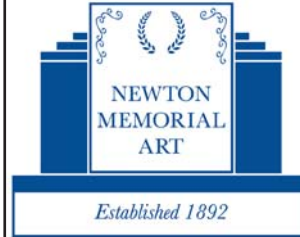
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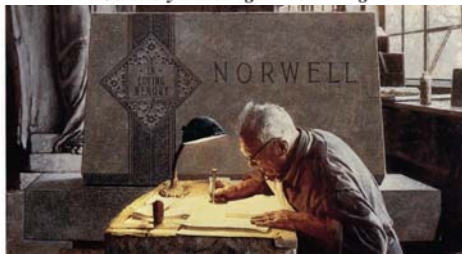
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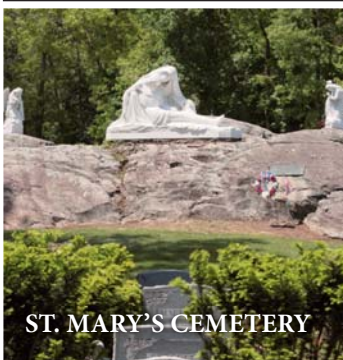
