

**THIRD SUNDAY OF THE YEAR:  
“SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD”**

In his *Motu Proprio* “*Aperuit illis*” (30 September 2019), Pope Francis designated this Third Sunday of the Year as a day “to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God ... A day devoted to the Bible should not be seen as a yearly event but rather a year-long event, for we urgently need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the Risen Lord, who continues to speak His Word and the break bread in the community of believers.”

In the spirit of this theme we might consider how we can deepen our acquaintance with Sacred Scripture in the coming year. One suggestion I have is to make use of the Scripture readings found in the Traditional Divine Office for the Temporal Cycle as a kind of study companion, a *vademecum*. This schema is outlined as follows ...





**EPISTLE:** From Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Romans, 12. 16-21 Brethren: Be not wise in your own conceits. To no man rendering evil for evil: providing good things, not only in the sight of God, but also in the sight of all men. If it be possible, as much as is in you, have peace with all men. Revenge not yourselves, my dearly beloved, but give place unto wrath, for it is written: Revenge is mine: I will repay, saith the Lord. But if thine enemy be hungry, give him to eat: if he thirst, give him to drink: for doing this, thou shalt heap coals of fire upon his head. Be not overcome by evil, but overcome evil by good.

And Jesus stretching forth His hand, touched him, saying: I will. Be thou made clean. And forthwith his leprosy was cleansed. And Jesus saith to him: See thou tell no man: but go, show thyself to the priest, and offer the gift which Moses commanded for a testimony unto them. And when he had entered into Capharnaum, there came to him a centurion, beseeching Him, and saying: Lord, my servant-boy lieth at home sick of the palsy, and is grievously tormented. And Jesus saith to him: I will come and heal him. And the centurion making answer, said: Lord, I am not worthy that Thou shouldst enter under my roof: but only say the word, and my servant shall be healed. For I also am a man subject to authority, having under me soldiers; and I say to this one: go, and he goeth; and to another, Come, and he cometh; and to my servant: Do this, and he doeth it. And Jesus hearing this, marveled, and said to them that followed Him: Amen I say to you, I have not found so great faith in Israel. And I say to you that many shall come from the east and the west, and shall sit down with Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven: but the children of the kingdom shall be cast out into the exterior darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. And Jesus said to the centurion: Go, and as thou hast believed, so be it done to thee. And the boy was healed at the same hour.






