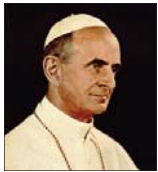

THE LIFE OF ST. KATHARINE DREXEL, AN AMERICAN SAINT

**“FIAT”
 (“BE-IT-DONE”)**

(Fourth Conference given on Friday, March 13th)

Our story now takes us to the aftermath of Francis Drexel’s death in February, 1885, when the three Drexel daughters in their twenties—Elizabeth, Katharine, and Louise—tried to put their lives back together again. Close to each other, they were of the same mind that they should continue to use their wealth to support the many charitable works of their parents and build upon them.

Katharine’s special charity at first was her support of the Catholic Indian Bureau, a contact which began when two American Indian missionaries showed up at the family home in Philadelphia asking to see the Misses Drexel. Katharine was the one who went down to receive them. They were seeking help for the building of Catholic schools at their missions. By saying “yes” to their initial request for funds, a whole world of the Catholic mission to the native tribes of the American Western Frontier was opened up to her.

In 1886 Katharine, Lizzie and Louise took an extended travel to Europe. In January of 1887 they were in Rome and had two private audiences with Pope Leo XIII. Those of you

who know the life-story of St. Thérèse of Lisieux will recall how she used the occasion of her audience with Pope Leo XIII to beg for his permission to enter Carmel even though she was underage. That audience occurred on November 20, 1887. Earlier that same year the Pope had heard a special request from Katharine Drexel, January 27, 1887. Here are Mother Katharine’s own words about

that event, as years later she remembered kneeling before the papal throne:

Then we went to Rome and had a private audience with Pope Leo XIII. Kneeling at his feet, my girlish fancy thought that surely God’s Vicar would not refuse me. So I pleaded missionary priests for Bishop O’Connor (of Omaha’s) Indians. To my astonishment His Holiness responded, “Why not, my child, yourself become a missionary?” In reply I said, “Because, Holy Father, sisters can be had for the missions, but no priests.”

This interview triggered an emotional upset in Katharine Drexel. Once outside she broke down sobbing, much to the dismay of her two sisters.

At that point they had no idea of the churning which had been going on in her soul about a possible religious vocation.

After their return from Europe the three sisters accepted the repeated invitations to come and see for themselves the Indian Missions which their charitable help was supporting. They made the trip in September of 1887. When the railroad travel ended they set out to cross the trackless and remote Indian reservations by horse and wagon. Elizabeth and Louise had brought their saddles and raced their horses along the prairie while Katharine, who did not care for horse-back riding, rode in the wagon with Bishop O'Connor and Father Stephan.

At Holy Rosary Mission in the Pine Bluff Agency they met the Indian Chief Red Cloud and presented him with gifts. Fr. Stephan explained that these young women were their friends and would help them to build the schools for the children of the tribe. A year later, in the fall of 1888, the three sisters made a second rough-riding expedition to another part of the Indian Northwest. Katharine was more invested than ever in the support of the Catholic Indian Missions.

But the question of her own personal religious vocation was burgeoning. She felt such a great desire to become a contemplative nun. Her spiritual director by correspondence, James O'Connor, the Bishop of Omaha, Nebraska, for a long time counseled her that she could do more good by staying "in-the-world". Perhaps she could satisfy her longing for a religious vocation by taking a private vow of virginity.

Katharine ultimately did not accept that. In February of 1889, sure that he had been enlightened by grace while he was offering Mass, Bishop O'Connor not only agreed at last that she should pursue a religious vocation, but also that she should *found* a new religious order in the Church specifically dedicated to the service of the American Indians and the Black poor. So it was then that on May 7, 1889, Miss Katharine Drexel, Philadelphia heiress, entered the Sisters of Mercy in Pittsburgh as a postulant, with the clear understanding of the superiors that the American bishops wanted

her trained in order for her to found this new religious community with its very particular apostolate.

Katharine took very well to religious life. On November 7, 1889 she was received as a Bride of Christ in solemn ceremony. She wore a wedding gown trimmed with orange blossoms. There were diamond rings on her fingers and diamonds in her necklace. Eight little girls in white satin dresses, and wearing white silk veils followed her. After her ceremony of reception she left the chapel in her bridal array and then returned shortly after in the habit and white veil of a Sister. Hers was now the promise of the Antiphon, *Veni Sponsa Christi*:

Come, thou Bride of Christ, and receive the Crown, which the Lord hath prepared thee forever

LATIN MASS PROPERS: PASSION SUNDAY

INTROIT: Psalm 42: 1-2 Judge me, O God, and distinguish my cause against an ungodly nation: O deliver me from the unjust and deceitful man: for Thou art my God and my strength. Psalm 42: 3 O send out Thy light and Thy truth: they have led me and brought me unto Thy holy hill, even unto Thy tabernacles.

COLLECT We beseech Thee, almighty God, mercifully look upon Thy family: that by Thy great goodness it may be governed in body and by Thy protection be preserved in mind. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: Hebrews 9: 11-15 Brethren: Christ being come, an High Priest of the good things to come, by a greater and more perfect tabernacle, not made with hands, that is, not of this creation: neither by the blood of goats or of calves, but by His own blood, entered once into the Holies, having obtained eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and of oxen and the ashes of an heifer, being sprinkled, sanctify such as are defiled, to the cleansing of the flesh: how much more shall the blood of Christ, who, by the Holy Ghost, offered Himself unspotted unto God, cleanse our conscience from dead works, to serve the living God? And therefore He is the Mediator of the new testament: that by means of His death, for the redemption of those transgressions which were under the former testament, they that are called may receive the promise of eternal inheritance, in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The Jews therefore said: Now we know that Thou hast a devil. Abraham is dead, and the prophets: and Thou sayest: If any man keep My word he shall not taste death for ever. Art Thou greater than our father Abraham, who is dead? and the prophets are dead, whom dost Thou make Thyself? Jesus answered: If I glorify Myself, My glory is nothing: it is My Father that glorifieth Me, of whom you say that He is your God, and you have not known Him: but I know Him: And if I shall say that I know Him not, I shall be like to you, a liar. But I do know Him, and do keep His word. Abraham your father rejoiced that he might see My day: he saw it and was glad. The Jews therefore said to Him: Thou art not yet fifty years old: and hast Thou seen Abraham? Jesus said to them: Amen, amen, I say to you, before Abraham was made, I am. They took up stones therefore to cast at Him: but Jesus hid Himself, and went out of the temple.**


