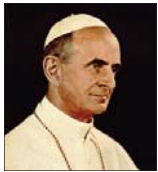

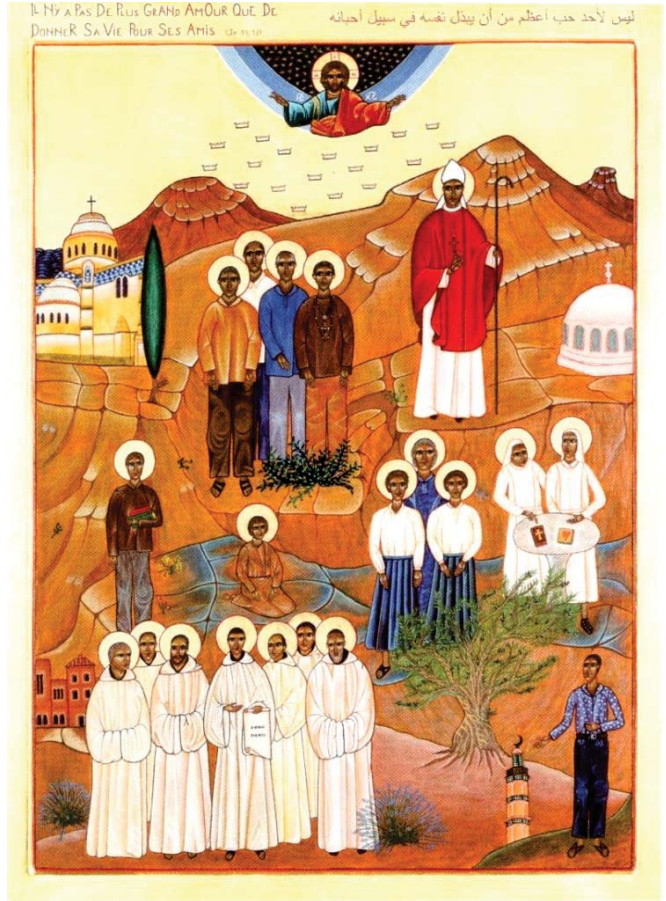


The Apostolic Visit of our Holy Father to Algeria this past week has brought to the fore the stories of the 19 Martyrs of Algeria: a Catholic bishop, priests, professed religious Brothers and Sisters, who were killed during the “Black Decade” of the Algerian Civil War in the 1990s. They were targeted as Christians by Islamist terrorist. Two of these Martyrs were Sisters from Pope Leo’s religious family, the

Augustinians: Sister Esther Paniagua Alonso and Sister Caridad Alvarez Martin. Both women were gunned down as they were about to enter a Catholic Chapel.



Seven of the Martyrs were Trappist monks from the Tibhirine monastery of Our Lady of Atlas, who were kidnapped from their community in March of 1996 and then murdered.

The Prior of the community, Dom Christian de Chergé, had spent part of his boyhood in French Algeria as the son of a French military officer. In 1959, he returned to Algeria as a French military officer himself during the Franco-Algerian War. During an ambush, his life was saved by an Algerian Muslim name Mohammed, a father of ten children. Filled with amazement and gratitude, Christian told Mohammed he would pray for him. The Muslim rescuer replied *“I know you will pray for me. But, look, Christians don’t know how to pray.”* The next day Mohammed was found brutally murdered for his deed of mercy to a Christian and a French military officer. Reflecting on this experience in later life Dom Christian said: *“In the blood of this friend, I knew that my calling to follow Christ meant to live, sooner or later, in the country where it was given to me the greatest gift of love.”*

The allusion if the *“greatest gift if love”* is to the passage of the Gospel where Christ says: *“Greater love than this no man hath, that a man lay down his life for his friends.” (John 15:13)*

On December 1st, 1993 and then again on January 1st, 1994, Dom Christian wrote a last Testament, which was opened on Pentecost Sunday, May 26th, 1996, just after his martyrdom. It begins:

Facing a GOOD-BYE ...

If it should happen one day—and it could be today—that I should become a victim of the terrorism which now seems ready to engulf all the foreigners living in Algeria, I would like my community, my Church, and my family to remember that my life was GIVEN to God and to this country.

I ask them to accept the fact that the One Master of all life was not a stranger to this brutal departure.

I would ask them to pray for me: for how could I be worthy of such an offering? I ask them to associate this death with so many other equally violent ones which are forgotten through indifference or anonymity. My life has no more value than any other. Nor any less value.

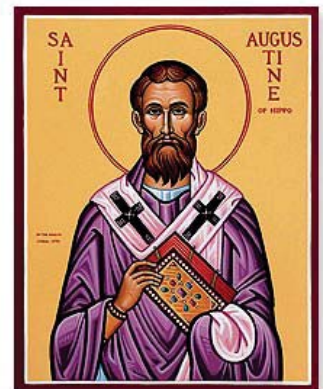
And in his conclusion he offers a great expression of gratitude to God, to his nearest and dearest among his family and friends, and at least even to his possible murderer, whom he calls his *“last-minute friend”*:

For this life lost, totally mine and totally theirs, I thank God, who seems to have willed it entirely for the sake of that JOY in everything and in spite of everything.

In this THANK YOU, which is said for everything in my life from now on, I certainly include you, friends of yesterday and today, and you, my friends of this place, along with my mother and father, my sisters and brothers and their families, You are the hundred-fold granted as was promised!

And also, you, my last-minute friend, who will not have known what you were doing: Yes, I want this THANK YOU and this GOOD-BYE to be a “GOD-BLESS” for you, too, because in God’s face I see yours. May we meet again as happy thieves in Paradise, if it please God, the Father of us both.

These Algerian Martyrs were beatified in 2018. Their Feast-day is May 8th, which happens also to be the day of Pope Leo’s election by the Conclave last year.
